Message from the President



Our Chief Executive, Mrs. Carrie Lam has delivered her maiden policy address. There are four good paragraphs concerning Primary Healthcare. Back in early 1990s, she had set out a blueprint for the delivery of primary healthcare and finally after 27 years, she has the chance to implement. She reiterates that a comprehensive and co-ordinated

primary healthcare system will enhance overall public health, reduce hospital re-admission and rectify the situation where accident and emergency service is regarded as the first point of contact in seeking medical consultation. These all sound very familiar as the College is always advocating for family doctor led primary healthcare.

The Government will set up a steering committee on primary healthcare development to review the existing planning and draw up a development blueprint. A model for district-based medical-social collaboration is suggested. I hope the College will have a strong representation in this steering committee to voice our view and point out the right path for the primary care in the years to come.

Prior to her policy address, Mrs. Lam has made a new suggestion to the composition of the Medical Council. Hong Kong Academy of Medicine will get two extra seats through election and also keep the two existing seats by nomination. The two extra seats are derived from the Department of Health and Hospital Authority with each organization giving up one seat. I was called to a special meeting convened by the Academy at the end of September to discuss this intention. There was a unanimous decision to accept this proposal. I have stressed before the Academy is the best representation for the College at the Medical Council. If the Amendment Bill passes through the Legislative Council this time without much filibustering, I am sure the Academy will organize an open forum to discuss the process of nomination and election of the Academy's representatives. The past two years I have advocated more seats for the Academy in the Medical Council, another wishful thinking may come true!

I attended a debriefing meeting organized by Centre for Health Protection (CHP) last month for the incident of

excess lead in drinking water in 2015. After conducting 5,655 blood lead level (BLL) tests covering the affected group, only 2.9% were found to have mildly elevated BLL (5.0 to 16.7 ug/dL). The observed mild elevation did not and is not expected to result in observable clinical features. Given the mild elevation, no one required chelation therapy or any other specific treatment. The recent news headline reveals the Water Supplies Department will launch an Enhanced Water Quality Monitoring Programme starting in December 2017. This programme intends to extend the assurance of drinking water quality from connection points to consumers' taps and will test six metals, namely antimony, cadmium, chromium, copper, lead and nickel that may be present in internal plumbing systems. The interesting point is that the risk of significant health effects due to consumption of drinking water tainted with these five metals antimony, cadmium, chromium, copper, nickel is very low! Experience gained from the incident of excess lead in drinking water in 2015 showed that the most important element of clinical management for people having consumed lead contaminated water is cessation of further exposure to contaminated water. Over time, lead will pass out of the body. This programme will certainly reveal few pipes that have raised level of the six metals. The CHP will organize three talks on this topic in October and November 2017 and we need to enhance our knowledge to calm the nerves of the public.

I have the illusion of being employed by the CHP. Since March this year, I have chaired the Advisory Group for Antibiotic Stewardship in Primary Care Settings in Hong Kong under the umbrella of CHP. Antibiotics stewardship programme is to measure antibiotic prescribing; to improve antibiotic prescribing by clinicians and use by patients so that antibiotics are only prescribed and used when needed and in accordance with evidence-based recommendations; and to ensure that the right drug, dose and duration are selected when an antibiotic is used. You will soon receive the first three guidance notes on acute pharyngitis, acute uncomplicated cystitis in women and simple skin and soft tissue infections. Any suggestions of other infections that we may include are most welcome.



2018 Full Exit Examination of Vocational Training in Family Medicine

The Specialty Board is pleased to announce the following information on the 2017 Full Examination of Vocational Training in Family Medicine.

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENT

Applicants must fulfill the following criteria:

- Full registration with the Hong Kong Medical Council
- Being active Fellows, Full or Associate Members of the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians (HKCFP)
- Fulfill the CME / CPD requirements under HKCFP Quality Assurance Programme in the preceding year
- Have a qualification in family medicine / general practice; which is recognized by the HKCFP and the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM)
- Had completed higher training in Family Medicine, **OR expected to do so by February 28, 2018**; as certified/ approved by the Board of Vocational Training and Standards (BVTs), HKCFP.

The relevant approval may take up to two months, therefore applicants are recommended to apply early to BVTs for

- Certification of completion of higher training **OR**
 - Recommendation to sit for Exit Examination 2018
- Active in clinical practice and able to meet the following requirements in individual Examination segments:
 - Clinical Audit: the starting date must be within 3 years before the exam application deadline
 - Research: the date of ethics approval must be within 3 years before the exam application deadline
 - Practice Assessment: submit valid Practice Management Package (PMP) reports

Eligibility to enroll in Exit Examination is subject to the final approval of the Specialty Board, HKCFP. Application will be processed only if all the required documents are submitted with the examination application form.

CME/CPD Compliance

Dear Colleagues,

With the QA&A Programme finalizing by the end of year 2017, just to highlight that Colleagues **must engage in ALL categories of activities** in order to fulfill the QA certificate criteria, briefly summarized as follows (QA Certificate 2017-19):

- (1) A minimum of 90 points in total, including **at least 30 points CPD points**
- (2) A maximum of 45 credit points will be counted for each category of educational activities
- (3) Participant must engage in **ALL** categories of activities

Please refer to the "Regulations for Award of Quality Assurance 2017-19 (QA)" for details: http://www.hkcfp.org.hk/pages_5_81.html

In particular, HKAM Fellows are required to obtain the minimum of 90 points, including **at least 15 CPD points** in a 3-year cycle.

Another point to highlight is the various ways to gain CPD points, listed below for your reference:

 - III. Evidence Based Practice (EBP) report with the reference to a journal article published in the HK Practitioner, the HK Medical Journal, or in an indexed or refereed Medical Journal
 - IV. Practice Audit, Review and Appraisal; include Clinical Audit, Evidence-Based Medical Protocol and Preventive Care Audit
 - V. Structured Learning Activities, such as Portfolio For Self Learning Plan
2. Activities related to Teaching, Educational Development and Research
 - I. Teaching / Tutoring medical students in Family Medicine
 - II. Clinical supervisor of vocational trainees in Family Medicine
 - III. Acting as examiner for the Conjoint HKCFP / RACGP Fellowship Examination or HKCFP Exit Examination
 - IV. Being a CPR instructor of the Assessment Enhancement Course organized by the College
 - V. Being a moderator or speaker
 - VI. Being a chairperson / speaker of the pre-approved small discussion group
 - VII. Research work related to the field of General Practice / Family Medicine
 - VIII. Publishing Journal articles, books or thesis
3. Activities related to Professional Development, such as demonstration of competence in Family Medicine by completing a course of study and passing the Conjoint HKCFP/RACGP Fellowship Examination, Specialty Board Exit Examination, the basic life support (CPR) assessment organized by the College, Diploma examinations organized by the College; passing professional examination (Membership / Fellowship, etc) or academic examination (Diploma / Master Degree, etc) relevant to General Practice/Family Medicine
4. Activities related to Quality Development, including participating in a quality assurance activity, exercise, workshop or clinical attachment organized by the College. Active Learning Mode (ALM) has been introduced since 2016 to facilitate active learning at selected seminars involving skill and knowledge transfer, participants may gain CPD points when fulfilling assessment criteria by pre- and post- activity MCQs.

Given the College Secretariat has now taken up the processing of MCHK CME record for members who use the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) as their Administrator for the said programme, **the associated administration charge will be waived provided that prior written consent is received by the College Secretariat**.

Interested members please note the following points for your consent:

1. MCHK registrants have the responsibility to liaise with your current CME Administrator (HKMA, DU, and DH) for the necessary procedures in relation to change of the CME Administrator.
2. As required by HKAM, change of CME Administrator can only be arranged after a cycle of programme has completed.
3. In case of any discrepancy of the accredited CME Points between the College and the other Administrators, the College reserves the right of the final decision on the accredited CME Points.

As the College is required to report the CME Points to HKAM every 6 months,

4. Members who will attend overseas conferences are required to submit the record of the attendance to the Academy for CME Accreditation within one month of the completion of the conference.
5. Members who are going to undertake self-study are requested to submit the details of the programme within one month of the completion of the self-study.
6. MCHK CME registrants should continue to sign on the respective HKAM CME attendance record sheet for CME record purpose as usual. **To help the College secretariat distinguishing College members from others, please identify yourself by entering your HKCFP membership number or simply putting "HKCFP" in the column of HKAM.**

Support Breastfeeding: the HK Code and FP Can Do More

Breastfeeding in Hong Kong

With the united efforts on breastfeeding promotion, the society is more aware of the benefits of breastfeeding. More women choose to breastfeed their infants and the ever-breastfeeding rate in Hong Kong has been increasing from 19% in 1992 to 87% in 2016. However, the exclusive breastfeeding rate was only 31% at 4 months for babies born in 2016. In order to protect and support breastfeeding, Hong Kong Code of Marketing of Formula Milk and Related Products, and Food Products for Infants & Young Children (the HK Code) was issued in June 2017.

The HK Code <香港守則>

The HK Code advocates good marketing practices of formula milk and food products for children below 3 years old. It provides recommendations to relevant sectors including health care workers of children:

- Health workers should encourage and protect breastfeeding.
- Health workers may demonstrate the use of infant formula when it is considered necessary and should give a clear information on the following:
 - the benefits and superiority of breastfeeding;
 - the value of exclusive breastfeeding for the first 6 months followed by sustained breastfeeding up to 2 years or beyond;
 - why it is difficult to reverse a decision not to breastfeed;
 - instructions for the proper preparation and use of feeding bottle and teat, including cleaning and sterilisation of feeding utensils;
 - the health risks of feeding by formula milk, feeding by using a feeding bottle and teat and improper preparation of feeding bottle and teat;
 - explanations that powdered formula milk is not a sterile product and that to minimise the risks of serious illness, formula milk which is intended for consumption by infants under 6 months of age should be prepared using boiled water cooled down to no less than 70 °C ;
 - formula milk should be prepared one feed at a time and that the reconstituted formula milk should be consumed within 2 hours after preparation and any unused milk must be discarded; and
 - the financial implication of feeding an infant with formula milk.

Family physician can do more

A mother's choice of breastfeeding can be markedly influenced by the attitude and opinion of her family physician. When encountering a pregnant patient, family physicians can introduce the subject of infant feeding and express the support of breastfeeding.

Continuing parental support results in higher breastfeeding maintenance rate. Family physicians should be equipped with knowledge of common breastfeeding problems, including:

- Growth patterns, feeding and sleep patterns, normal stool and voiding patterns of breastfed babies
- Management of growth spurts
- Recognition of hunger and satiety cues
- Positioning and attachment
- Management of sore nipples, low milk supply, engorgement, blocked ducts and mastitis
- Maintaining lactation when separated from the infant (e.g. during illness or return to work)
- Maternal medication use and maternal illness during breastfeeding

Women are more likely to continue breastfeeding if their doctors encourage them to do so. Provide a breastfeeding-friendly environment in the clinic by displaying relevant educational leaflets and allowing breastfeeding in the waiting area. Build up a list of community resources (e.g. local breastfeeding specialists, community support groups) and be familiar with the referral procedures.

Let's provide the best nutrition for our future generations.

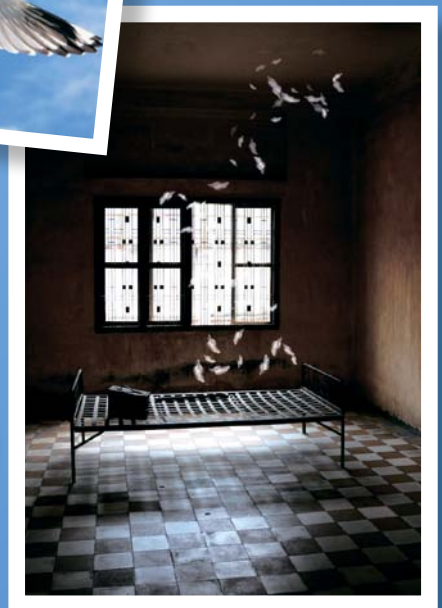

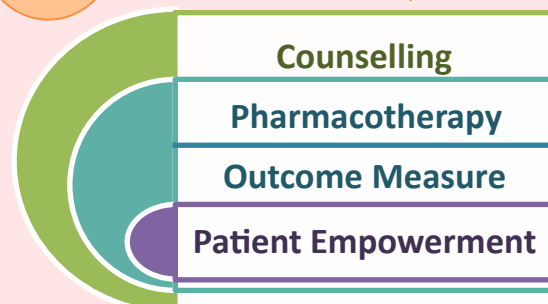

跟很多家庭醫生一樣，我選擇做家庭醫生是因為遇到一位好老師。

跟很多家庭醫生不一樣，我遇到的這位好老師是外國人。

Learning Points:

Dr. Chan covered a stepwise treatment approach to psoriasis, with a focus on updated information on biologics treatment.

Psoriasis Area & Severity Index (PASI) is a tool used to measure the severity and extent of Psoriasis. PASI can be used as a score of response to treatment - PASI 75 is the percentage of patients achieved 75% improvement in PASI from baseline.

Biologics treatment is indicated for severe psoriasis, i.e. PASI ≥ 10 , DLQI > 10 . There are currently two groups of biologics therapy – TNF- α antagonists and Interleukin pathway inhibitor. TNF- α antagonist has higher secondary treatment failure compared to the newer Interleukin inhibitors. This is due to formation of antibodies with time.

Characteristics of Individual Biologics

- ▶ **Adalimumab:** rapid onset
 - Anti-adalimumab antibodies develop in 8.4%
- ▶ **Infliximab:** rapid onset, high secondary failure rate
 - paradoxical aggravation of psoriasis
 - Anti-infliximab antibodies develop in 19%
- ▶ **Etanercept:** less efficacious
 - maybe suitable for intermittent use
 - more evidence on paediatric group
- ▶ **Ustekinumab:**
 - High efficacy
 - Anti-ustekinumab antibodies developed in 5.1% of the patients by the end of week 76 (PHOENIX 1)
- ▶ **Secukinumab:**
 - High efficacy
 - Relatively new, less studies on long term side effects

In SCULPTURE Study, Secukinumab (IL-17A antibody) demonstrates sustained high efficacy and a favorable safety profile in moderate to severe psoriasis patients through 4 years of treatment. The average PASI improvement were consistently $>90\%$. Almost 100% of PASI 90 and PASI 100 response rates were maintained. Patients experienced long lasting relief from the burden of psoriasis. The safety profile was favorable without increase of events over time.

The contraindications for Biologics treatment include:
Absolute Contraindications

- Pregnancy/Breastfeeding
- Active(chronic) infections (including tuberculosis and active chronic hepatitis B)
- Congestive Heart Failure (NYHA grade III or IV)

Relative Contraindications

- History of recurrent infections; HIV/AIDS; Hepatitis C
- PUVA >200 treatments
- Congestive Heart Failure (NYHA grade I or II)
- Concomitant SLE, Demyelinating disease
- Malignancies or lymphoproliferative disorders
- Live Vaccines

Before starting Biologics treatment, it is important to screen for underlying Hepatitis and Tuberculosis (including test for latent infection). The suggested pre-treatment workup for biologics include:

- Check for skin cancer
- Check for lymphadenopathy
- CXR
- Mantoux test and/or Quantiferon test
- Blood test include Full blood count, liver enzymes, ESR/CRP, Serum Creatinine, HBV, HCV, HIV
- Pregnancy Test (and Contraception advice)
