Recap on previous arrangement

- Video tape 18 cases in 6 hours (net time)
- 2 hours per session (total 3 sessions) or 3 hours per session (total 2 sessions)
- Examination period: 7 calendar days
- Inform examination period 2 working days
- Total 6 cases selected out of 18 cases for assessment

Problems identified

- Candidates:
 - Too many cases
 - repeated re-take video, exhausted
- Examiners:
 - Lack of case varieties
 - Only simple URTI/chronic diseases Mx cases, not much psychosocial/ paediatric/ gynaecology cases
- Organization
 - Long examination duration
 - Difficulties on manpower and consultation room arrangement

Updates

- Video tape sessions
 - 12 cases in 2 sessions, each session 2 net hours. (total 4 hours)
 - Examination period limited to 1 day (0:00-23:59, the date need to be show on consultation notes for computer records, or approved by trainer for hand writing records)
 - Overtime: the 6th case should be started within 120 minutes of net time, otherwise, the minutes exceeding overall net time would be subtracted.
- Recommended case:
 - Candidates can give recommendation on "good performed case"
 - Up to 4 cases can be recommended.
 - At least 2 out of 4 recommended cases would be selected
 - Cases with diagnosing challenges, psychosomatic complains, not simple URTI/ GE

Other changes

- Inform of examination:
 - 1st call, One week before examination, to inform the exam would be arranged next week
 - 2nd call, at 4:00 pm, the day before examination, to inform examination period and email examination materials.
- Examination period: 24hours
- Submission of video: one day after examination date before 5:30 pm.
- Examination will be re-arranged if clinic closed due to adverse weather conditions (typhoon signal 8 or black rainstorms)
- All cases will be selected by examiners

It is not changed

- The recording should be done non-stop during each session.
- Submission of demo video
- Exam. Process, e.g. signboards, consent, answer questions
- Reassessment arrangement

Pros and cons

- Pros:
- Less workload for candidates (18 \rightarrow 12)
- Balance of reality and Varity
- Reality of candidate's usual practice could be reflected
- Variety could be improved by recommended case, and examiners could choose more case
- Unnecessary prolonged consultation could be reduced as the minutes exceeding overall net time would be subtracted.
- Easier manpower arrangement for the clinic (total 2 days)
- Cons:
- Possible "Artificial consultation" (recommended case)
- Candidates might feel stressful to complete examination in 1 day
- Need re-arrange examination if clinic closed or sick leave
