Elderly Health Care Voucher Scheme (HCVS)

- Aims: to provide subsidies for the elderly aged 70 or above to receive private primary healthcare services that best suit their needs. By encouraging elders to seek consultation and establish a closer relationship with private doctors, it also helps promote the concept of family doctor.
- Annual voucher amount: \$2,000 for each eligible elder.
- By the end of 2015, more than 5,200 private healthcare service providers have enrolled in the HCVS and around 79% of eligible elders have ever used vouchers.



Electronic Platform – Simple Claim Process

- · Elders do not need to collect vouchers and no pre-registration is required.
- Eligible elders can use the vouchers with his/her Hong Kong Identity Card by simply visiting an enrolled healthcare service provider's clinic and signing a consent form.






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Result of Readers' Survey 2015


The survey was conducted in September and October 2015. 58 questionnaires were returned. The results are summarized and presented as below.

Diploma in Family Medicine (HKCFP) 2016-17

The Board is pleased to announce that the Diploma Course in Family Medicine (DFM) organized by The Hong Kong College of Family Physicians will commence in July 2016.

The course consists of FIVE modules. Modules I & II will be delivered by Local Distance Learning. Modules III, IV & V consist of lectures, seminars, tutorials, workshops and clinical attachments. The whole course requires ONE year of part-time studies.

Details of the course are as follows:

1. Objectives:

- i) To provide knowledgeable, pragmatic and structured teaching in Family Medicine for medical practitioners.
- ii) To encourage professional development of practising medical practitioners and to provide an intermediate step to fellowship qualifications in Family Medicine.
- iii) To improve standards and quality in the practice of Family Medicine.

2. *Syllabus:

Module V - Practical Family Medicine (Practical Workshops)

Aims:	Enhance practical and communication skills in Family Medicine by Practical Workshops in selected areas including CPR, Consultation Skills, Counselling Skills, Women's Health, Orthopaedic Injection and Musculo-Skeletal Medicine

Module III & V will be scheduled on Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

3. Articulations:

The Course allows (up to a fixed maximum percentage of the Course units) articulations or cross recognition of previous Family Medicine training programmes that provide learning units equivalent to that of the above syllabus. Participants who wish to apply for such articulations have to submit evidence of relevant training together with their application. The granting of articulations is however, completely at the discretion and decision of the Board of DFM.

Trampoline-related injury in Hong Kong



The modern trampoline was patented by competitive gymnast George Nissen in 1945, designed for acrobats, gymnasts and eventually used by the military for training. Recreational trampoline use has increased in recent decades as the products have become more affordable. It is fun to jump and do somersaults on a trampoline and it is an engaging way to have one to do exercise. In Hong Kong, trampolining was once a part of school physical education classes. However, one landed wrongly can cause serious, permanent injuries.

In USA, thousands of people are injured on trampolines each year. Injuries can occur even when a trampoline has a net and padding and is used under supervision. Despite statements from numerous medical groups that discourage trampoline use and warnings to exercise caution on trampolines at home or on the playground, trampoline use and injuries remain a big problem. In USA, most of these injuries happen on home trampolines and children younger than 6 years are at the greatest risk of injury. With limited space, home trampolining is not popular in Hong Kong.

Trampolining dwindled in popularity in Hong Kong after an incident resulted in quadriplegia in 1991 but it comes to our spotlight again after recent reported incidents.

There are 8 admissions to a local hospital after awkward landing or performing a somersault in less than 2months. Other causes of trampoline-related injury are falling out of the trampoline and collision with another person as observed from overseas studies.

Different from popular use of home trampoline overseas where children are at risk, the local injured are age between 22 and 30 years. The age difference could explain the higher incidence of lower extremities injury in our local patients as untrained adults tend to be more conservative and land axially on their feet. Oversea studies showed a higher rate of upper extremities injuries among children, and it is also important to note injury involving spine are not uncommon both at local and overseas studies.

Regarding the type of injury, fractures, both at extremities and spine, constitute a significant proportion. A small proportion of local injuries were dislocation, ligament tear and muscle sprain. The problem may be underestimated as injuries that did not require hospital admission such as those patients who presented to general practitioners or who were discharged from emergency department were not fully evaluated. It is also difficult to draw comparisons with epidemiological data from other countries where the majority of injuries arise from home trampoline use and not from trampoline parks.

Trampolining may be perceived as a dangerous physical activity. This may not be the case; the risk of injury is not high compared with other physical activities. The risk of being injured during physical activity must be compared with the risk of being physically inactive. Jumping on a trampoline gives one the ability to improve their motor control and increase physical activity. The importance of having safety guidelines for the use of trampolines is emphasized.

- Supervision at all times
- Only one jumper on the trampoline at a time
- No somersaults performed
- Adequate protective padding on the trampoline that is in good condition and appropriately placed with regular checking and repair/replacement if damaged
- Make sure insurance covers trampoline-related injury claims
