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Message from the President



March proved to be a busy month.

The Cross Strait Exchange conference was hosted at Xiamen, Fujian from 17th to 19th March. This year, the College had sent a delegation of nearly twenty headed by our Censors, Dr. Donald Li and Prof. Cindy Lam. The first day we had witnessed the first batch of three recipients of HKCFP Donald Li

Scholarship. The scholarship was jointly presented by Donald and Prof. Amanda Howe, President of WONCA. Donald had his talk on WONCA and I concentrated on the development, training and examinations of the College.

Drs. Lau Ho Lim, Liang Jun, Dao Man Chi, Chiang Lap Kin, and Dana Lo had all contributed to the various topics and showed a strong Hong Kong presence. I must also thank our Executive Manager, Ms. Erica So in helping promote our 40^{th} Anniversary Conference to the 2000 delegates. China healthcare reform has put a major emphasis on our discipline and I was heartening to see significant progress in skill development, recruitment and aspiration for more trained family doctors.

Most of us missed the chance to visit Piano Island (Gulangyu) in Xiamen but this was well compensated by the delicious "free" dinner offered by Donald and we all knew he was synonymous with high standard cuisine.

Professor Martin Roland was the inaugural Chair in Health Services Research, University of Cambridge. He was appointed the HKCFP Visiting Professor in Family Medicine of the University of Hong Kong and visited us from 24th -31st March 2017. He was a GP at Manchester, UK and is a keen supporter of Manchester United knowing that there are a lot of Red Devils in Hong Kong.

His visit started with the Primary Care Research Symposium co-organized by Department of Family Medicine and Primary Care, HKU and the College on 25th March, 2017. Professor Roland delivered the keynote speech on "Designing Health Care Systems for Patients with Complex Conditions". Most healthcare systems in the world including Hong Kong face increasing challenges from patients with multiple health



problems including elderly people with frailty and advanced illness. Often the needs of these patients are poorly met by existing health services, especially those focusing on care by sub-specialists, those designed for single episodes of care, and those where remuneration is based on fee for service. All these tend to fragment care for this group of patients who need team-based whole-person care. This is a true reflection of the present healthcare system in Hong Kong. He was also involved in a lively Roundtable Discussion on "The Future of Primary Care" in which I was a discussant. Here came my favourite topic on training and manpower, highlighting the severe lack of trained family doctors in Hong Kong.

He thought there were many opportunities for Hong Kong to play a vital role in the development of primary care in Mainland, and encouraged us to collaborate with local and overseas universities to build teaching and research capacity. He observed that our family medicine and primary care undergraduate curriculum depended a lot on the good will of many honorary teachers, who are members of the College, in teaching students in their practices. This might be difficult to sustain without Government subsidy. The sharing of his experience from the United Kingdom has sent out a strong message to the Government and society at-large the importance of investing in family medicine and primary care for the aging population.



Diploma in Family Medicine (HKCFP) 2017-18

The Board is pleased to announce that the Diploma Course in Family Medicine (DFM) organized by The Hong Kong College of Family Physicians will commence in July 2017.

The course consists of FIVE modules. Modules I & II will be delivered by Local Distance Learning. Modules III, IV & V consist of lectures, seminars, tutorials, workshops and clinical attachments. The whole course requires ONE year of part-time studies.

Details of the course are as follows:

1. Objectives:

- i) To provide knowledgeable, pragmatic and structured teaching in Family Medicine for medical practitioners
- ii) To encourage professional development of practising medical practitioners and to provide an intermediate step to fellowship qualifications in Family Medicine
- iii) To improve standards and quality in the practice of Family Medicine

Entry and assessment criteria are listed below:

Entry Criteria:

- 1. The principal investigator has to be a Member or a Fellow of the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians.
- 2. The research must be original work of the investigator(s).
- 3. The research should be conducted in Hong Kong.
- 4. The research must have been completed.

- 6. How useful are the results for patient care in the discipline of Family Medicine?
- 7. How much effort is required to complete the research study?

Each research project submitted will be assessed according to the seven criteria listed above by a selection panel. Each criterion may attract a different weighting to be decided by the selection panel. A Weekend of Fruitful Scholastic Rendezvous

During a beautiful weekend in spring, more than 2000 doctors gathered in Xiamen, China to attend the Fourth Cross-Straits Conference on General Practice from 17 to 19 March 2017. The Hong Kong College of Family Physicians was invited to be one of the co-organisers of this conference. We had a delegation of more than a dozen doctors from Hong Kong.

On the day before the conference, the Executives Meeting and then the Council Meeting of the Cross-Straits Medicine Exchange Association and Commission of General Practice (CMEACGP) (海峽兩岸醫藥衛生交流協會全科醫學專業委員會) were held. Prof. Cindy Lam, Dr. Angus Chan, Dr. Lau Ho Lim and Dr. Lorna Ng were invited to both Meetings. During these meetings, the progress reports and the future plans of the CMEACGP were discussed. A Youth Chapter would be created. The best papers of the conference and the Ten Best Council Members were announced. The GP training courses organized by the Board of Professional Development and Services (BPDS), HKCFP was reported as receiving positive reception from GP units in China and the cooperation would continue.

The Conference in Xiamen was opened officially on Saturday 18 March by Prof. Zhu Shanzhu and other notable figures in general practice in China. One of the highlights of the opening is the award ceremony of the HKCFP Donald Li Scholarship. Prof. Amanda Howe, President of WONCA, and Dr. Donald Li, President-Elect of WONCA, presented the Scholarship to the three awardees.

The aim of the HKCFP Donald Li Scholarship is to provide an opportunity for outstanding family doctors in China with the appropriate knowledge, attitude and practical experience to have further practical family medicine training opportunities in Hong Kong. The Scholarship would be awarded to three practising frontline doctors in China who have attended the Training Course in Family Medicine in Hong Kong co-organised by the HKCFP and the CMEACGP each year. Each recipient of the Scholarship would receive HK\$10,000 for further practical family medicine training in Hong Kong for one week. They will be assigned to attachments in approved Family Medicine training centres in Hong Kong.

Because of the clinical-oriented training provided by the Scholarship, only practising front-line doctors will be considered for the Scholarship. The awardees of the Scholarship will be vetted by a selection committee formed under the Board of Professional Development and Services, Hong Kong College of Family Physicians, based on the following criteria:

- 1) The applicant's performance during the Training Course in Hong Kong,
- 2) The practical experience of the applicants, and
- 3) An essay not more than 800 words outlining their specific learning objectives in family medicine and their views on family medicine learning.

After the opening ceremony, the conference went into full swing. Prof. Amanda Howe presented the current status of international Family Medicine training, followed by a summary in Putonghua by Dr. Donald Li. In the afternoon, our President Dr. Angus Chan spoke on the development and training of Family Medicine in Hong Kong in one of the plenary sessions.

On Sunday morning, among the 4 parallel forums, there was one for young GPs. One young doctor each from China, Taiwan and Hong Kong co-chaired this Forum. Dr. Dana Lo, one of our Council Members, was one of them. She, together with Dr. Dao Man Chi and Dr. Chiang Lap Kin, shared their experience and presented their interests.

While on young doctors, it is imperative to mention that the HKCFP is very supportive of the current international trend of a developmental emphasis on young doctors. In our recent Council Meeting, it was agreed that Dr. Loretta Chan would be HKCFP's representative in the new Youth







Chapter in the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Loretta is an extremely dedicated and versatile young doctor in our College. She is a member of our Council and she has also made tremendous contributions in the 3 Boards and 2 Committees, one as Chairman, in which she currently serves (Board of Conjoint Examination, Board of Diploma in Family Medicine, Board of Professional Development and Services, Membership Committee and Public Education Committee). We can be pretty sure our future will be in good hands.

In the afternoon of 19 March, there was a forum organised solely for the training course for mainland doctors provided by the BPDS. This Forum was cochaired by Dr. Lau Ho Lim, Chairman of BPDS, and 2 other students from the first training course, who are also experienced trainers in their respective GP units in China. Dr. Lau opened the Forum with an introduction of our training course and its main learning points and future development. He then introduced all teachers in our course to the audience and invited to the stage those teachers who went to Xiamen: Drs. Loretta Chan, Mark Chan, Jun Liang, Dana Lo, Jenny Wang and Yu Ching Ching. After that, Dr. Jun Liang, Vice Chairman of BPDS, gave an insightful presentation of the important conceptual principles of doctor-patient communication. It was then followed by presentations by the 3 awardees of the HKCFP Donald Li Scholarship and 4 other past students of our course, of what they had learned from the course and how they had applied it to their daily practice and/or teaching activities.

This Conference in Xiamen has provided an excellent opportunity for us to meet old friends and make new ones, both on academic and personal levels. What is really important is the continual and significant recognition by doctors in China of our College's expertise in teaching and learning Family Medicine. At the same time, we all are happy to witness the fast growth of Family Medicine in China in general, and the contribution of our College over the years towards this growth in particular.

On this occasion we did not meet others only. Attending the Plenaries and Forums and listening to other family physicians' presentations, we also met the very first passion inside us that drove us into Family Medicine as a life-long professional endeavour. It is a time when both interpersonal and intrapersonal actualisations went hand in hand.

We would definitely have fond memories of all these happy and fruitful scholastic rendezvous in Xiamen.

New Choice for Oral Anti-Coagulation for Atrial Fibrillation

Atrial fibrillation is not uncommonly encountered in family medicine practice. As we all know, it is associated with stroke, which is one of the leading causes of death and can cause significant morbidity.

The thromboembolic risk of atrial fibrillation can be reduced by two third with anticoagulation therapy compared to placebo, but it is used mainly in the moderate to high risk group (CHA2DS2-VASc risk stratification score \geq 2) due to bleeding risk resulted from the treatment. For the low risk group, antiplatelet agents such as aspirin is used.

Traditionally, warfarin is the drug of choice when anticoagulant is indicated. But it needs frequent blood test monitoring, strict diet control and it interacts with quite some numbers of drugs which limit its use. Currently, a new group of medicine called NOAC (Novel Oral Anti-coagulant /Non Vitamin K antagonist Oral Anti-coagulant/New oral anticoagulant) provides a reasonable alternative. E.g. dabigatran, rivaroxaban, and apixaban.

In a meta-analysis in Lancet in December 2013, it is found that risk of stroke in NOAC and warfarin group were 3.1% and 3.8% respectively. The difference was mainly driven by a reduction of haemorrhagic stroke. The risk of intracranial haemorrhage was reduced with relative risk reduction of around 50% but gastrointestinal bleeding risk was higher with hazard ratio 1.25.

In a recent observational nationwide cohort study published in British Medical Journal in June 2016, all three NOACs mentioned above are comparable to warfarin and without significant difference in preventing stroke. The combined bleeding risk of rivaroxaban (5.3%) is comparable with warfarin (5.0%), while bleeding risk of apixaban (3.3%) and dabigatran (2.4%) is lower.

In summary, NOACs are comparable with warfarin in reducing stroke with a slightly favorable side effect profile under current evidence. It is more convenient that it does not need strict diet restriction, and INR monitoring with less drug-drug interaction, but a higher drug cost.



大久野島 (Okunoshima) 位於日本瀨戶內海的廣島和四國之間,屬廣島縣竹原市忠海町。它有「從地圖上消失的 島」和「毒氣島」之稱。1929至1945年間,大久野島是日軍的化學武器生產基地,生產了超過六千噸的芥子毒 氣及其他毒氣。隨著戰爭結束,駐日盟軍及日本政府拆除毒氣生產設施及銷毀遺下的武器,大久野島亦從此長時 間變成了無人島。

700,000平方公尺的大久野島現在也是約700頭野生兔子的棲息地[,]所以也被稱為「兔島」或「兔子樂園」。島 上的兔子種類是「穴兔」(Oryctolagus cuniculus),一種原產於西南歐(西班牙和葡萄牙)的兔子。關於島上兔子 的來源有兩個傳說。傳說一:為了實驗芥子毒氣,當年日軍帶著兔子上島。戰爭結束後,實驗用的兔子也跟著一同 被丢棄[,]它們在沒有天敵的良好條件下肆無忌憚地繁殖。傳説二:1971年[,]一群來戶外旅行的學生在這裡放生了 8隻兔子,從此兔子便在這裡繁衍。「兔島」現時的主要景點包括渡假村、旅客中心及毒氣資料館。因為每年約有 10萬多遊客前往此島,在「見慣見熟」的情況下,兔子都完全變得不怕人了。

怎樣去「兔島」?

要前往大久野島,先要到忠海車站,才 能轉船到大久野島。



至於要如何到忠海呢?主要有3個方 法:

- 1) 從廣島駅乘坐JR吳線的「安芸路 ライナー」、於廣站轉乘吳線普通 列車到忠海,車程約2小時,車費 約1300円;
- 2) 從廣島駅乘坐JR山陽本線到三 原,再在三原轉吳線普通列車到 忠海,車程約2小時,廣島往三原 的山陽本線班次比「方法1」的要 密, 車費約2000円;

3) 從廣島駅乘坐JR山陽新幹線到三 原,再在三原轉吳線普通列車到 忠海,車程約1小時,車程最短但 當然車費最貴,車費約4000円。

如果是在廣島以外地方前住,基本上 也是利用三原轉車的方法,例如由鄰 近的尾道過來,或者是關西地區等。

到忠海車站後,再步行約3至5分鐘 就可到達碼頭轉船到大久野島。忠海 往大久野島船程約15分鐘,來回船票 620円,可以一次過在碼頭售票處購 買。售票處也有兔糧買。



最後,是愛護兔子應注意的事項:

- 1. 切勿追趕兔 子,也不要抱 兔子 - 兔子 是軟弱的動 物,處於緊張 狀態時,容易 受傷/骨折。
- 2. 為了遊客和兔 子安全,切勿 在馬路或路 邊接觸兔子。



- 3. 切忌伸手到兔子的嘴巴前 因兔 子的牙齒很尖但視力不太好。如果 將兔糧直接送到兔子嘴巴前,很容 易會被咬傷手指。
- 4. 切勿給兔子吃糕點或麵包,會導致 生病。
- 5. 為免影響島上原有的生態,切勿偷 偷帶兔子和其他動物到島上,也不 要隨地扔垃圾。

Learning Points:

This talk is about atopic dermatitis (AD). Dr. Ong described the demographics and clinical presentation of atopic eczema followed by the pathophysiology. The treatment methods were also presented. Dr. Rust supplemented the scientific background of pathogenesis and treatment of AD.

Dr. Ong started the talk with the epidemiology of the disease. AD is the most common chronic skin disease in children; in which 20-30% persist into adulthood. AD is a clinical diagnosis presented with pruritus and eczema with chronic relapsing course. Seventy percent of patients have family history. AD is generally the first manifestation of atopy accompanied by other allergic disorders. The pruritus, sleep disturbance and comorbidities of AD affects patients' quality of life.

At the moment, immune dysregulation and epidermal barrier defect are believed to be major pathogenesis. Altered permeability barrier and reduced moisture content of stratum corneum are the culprit. Ceramides play a crucial role in barrier function.

Regarding treatment of AD, it should be individualized. Multimodal approach may be necessary. In initial acute therapy, appropriately potent agents can be used. For maintenance therapy, there is emphasis on emollients and other modalities such as dilute bleach bath. Step up approach was presented. It begins with emollients, and then to topical corticosteroids, calcineurin inhibitors and systemic treatment such as phototherapy, cyclosporine, azathioprine and methotrexate. More advanced treatment modalities including targeted immunotherapies were mentioned.

The importance of moisturiser which was the cornerstone of AD management was elaborated. The principles of occlusion, humectancy, emolliency which are central to stratum corneum maintenance were discussed. Studies showed that combination of topical steroids and moisturiser is more effective than topical steroids alone in management of AD.

Dr. Rust further added in his presentation about the scientific basis of skin barrier and its mechanism in preventing excessive moisture loss from skin. The need for frequent moisture use and skin barrier protective agents were mentioned. The information enriched the understanding of the theoretic basis behind different treatment modalities.

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
