Nomination to FHKAM


The College has run vocational training programme for family doctors for over 20 years in accordance with the requirements of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. In order to align the comparable qualifications and training requirements in Family Medicine for doctors who have been trained locally and those who have been trained overseas, HKCFP has set up a working group to conduct a thorough review of the existing practice and elaborated on the details of comparable training since 2013.

After 2 years of hard work and with reference to international training standards, I am delighted to inform you that we have successfully aligned the comparable experience of the 6 years training requirement for nomination to HKAM fellow for Members and Fellows with HKCFP recognised intermediate qualifications such as FHKCFP, FRACGP, MRCGP, FRCGP, CCFP, FCFP, DABFP, FAAFP, MRNZCGP, FRNZCGP, and MICGP. This alignment has been approved by the Council of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine in August 2015 allowing family doctors who have already acquired HKCFP recognised intermediate qualifications to be eligible for nomination as HKAM Fellows if they fulfill the prevailing training requirements.

I encourage all our College Members and Fellows who hold the abovementioned intermediate qualifications and would contemplate to become HKAM Fellows and to achieve the status of Specialist in Family Medicine to take note of these new developments and contact our Board of Vocational Training and Standards.

I have to thank Dr. Ruby Lee for heading the Working Group in the review and Dr. David Chao in presenting the case to the Education Committee, HKAM.

The Research Committee of HKCFP is proud to continue to offer the two research funds, The Trainees Research Fund and the Research Seed Fund

The Trainees Research Fund will be opened to all registered HKCFP trainees and is made of four awards (each up to HK\$5,000). It is envisaged it will help trainees especially (but not limited to) those doing research projects as their exit examination. Those who have funding support elsewhere will not be considered

The Research Seed Fund is open to all HKCFP members when a maximum of \$10,000 award will be made to the successful applicant to assist the conduction of a research project.

Winners of the award will receive 50% of the approved grant up front and the remainder 50% upon completion of the project.

Assessment Criteria for both funds:

1. Academic rigor of the paper (e.g. originality, methodology, organization and presentation);

2. Relevance and impact to family medicine & primary care (e.g. importance of the topic and the impact of the findings on the practice or development of the discipline); and

3. Overall budget

Overview of DFM Macau and CFM Shunde

Dr. Chan Man Li Coordinator of DFM Macau, Board of Diploma in Family Medicine, HKCFP

It gives me a great honour to introduce our college's well organized and structured training programme for overseas doctors. The HKCFP's Diploma of Family Medicine [DFM] course has extended the teaching to Macau doctors since 2012 with the invitation by the Department of Health of the Macau Government SAR.



Mission of the DFM Programme

- To provide a knowledgeable, pragmatic and structured teaching in Family Medicine for medical practitioners and for medical trainees who intend to take up Family Medicine as their career
- 2. To encourage professional development of practising medical practitioners and to attain the qualification in Family Medicine
- To improve standards and quality in the practice of Family Medicine

The course contents are very comprehensive and are divided into 2 parts and 5 modules:

1st Part: [distance learning]

Module I - Principles of Family Medicine

Module II – Common Problems in Family
Medicine

2nd Part : [practical workshop, attachment and seminar etc]

Module III – Essentials of Family Medicine (Structured Seminars)

Module IV - Family Medicine Attachment

Module V - Practical Family Medicine (Practical Workshops)

Our college speakers would travel to Macau to deliver the various workshops and seminars, except Women's Health & Orthopaedic Injection workshops in which the candidates need to come to the Wan Chai's premise of our college for the practical hand-on demonstration workshops.

The overall evaluation of the DFM course by our students is very encouraging and supportive regarding our teaching. As shown in the below table of the cumulative data of course evaluation, the two key components of the quality of presentation and the enhancement of the knowledge and skills achieved very high rating from the students.

After the academic and practical learning for the whole year, we have the DFM written examination and objective structured clinical examination [OSCE] to assess and safeguard the standard of our DFM course graduates. The results, especially the passing rate, are very promising. There were around 60 successful graduates over the past 3 years.

In 2014, we were invited again by the Government of Macau SAR Department of Health to launch the Certificate course on Clinical Communication and Diagnosis [CCD] to teach and enhance the clinical communication skill and diagnostic skill for resident doctors enrolled for various specialties. There were 14 successful CCD candidates enrolled in 2014-15, some of them have further pursued for the DFM course in the year next to completion.

Trans fat, worst among the bad

In the past, we believe unsaturated fatty acid is healthier than saturated fatty acid. However recent evidence found that Trans fat, also called trans-fatty acids (TFA), despite the presence of unsaturated fatty acid, is considered to be the worst type of dietary fat one can eat.

There are two sources of TFA:

- Trans fat formed naturally this type of TFA is produced in the gut of some grazing animals. That's why small quantities of TFA can be found in animal products like meat, milk, and milk products.
- Trans fat formed during food processing this type of TFA is created when hydrogen is added to vegetable oil (a process called hydrogenation) to make it more solid at room temperature. Manufactured form of TFA, known as Partially Hydrogenated Oils (PHOs) are used by food manufacturers to improve the texture, shelf life, and flavor stability of foods. This partially hydrogenated oil is less likely to spoil, so foods made with it have a longer shelf life. Some restaurants use partially hydrogenated vegetable oil in their deep fryers, because it doesn't have to be changed as often as compared to other oils.

Why TFA is bad?

Unlike other dietary fats, TFA raises Low density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol and lowers high density lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol. This can increase the risk of cardiovascular disease.

Actions on TFA in USA

Since 2006, USA manufacturers have been required to include TFA content information on the Nutrition Facts label of foods. Between 2003 and 2012, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (US FDA) estimates that consumer trans fat consumption decreased by about 78 percent.

Based on a thorough review of the scientific evidence, in 2013, the (US FDA) finalized its determination that PHOs, the primary dietary source of artificial trans fat in processed foods, are not "generally recognized as safe" for use in human food.

In June 2015, US FDA has set a compliance period of three years for food manufacturers to remove PHOs from products. Following the compliance period, no PHOs can be added to human food unless they are otherwise approved by the FDA. This action is expected to reduce coronary heart disease and prevent thousands of fatal heart attacks every year.

Local Situation

Hong Kong is one of the first few places in the world that requires the declaration of TFA content on nutrition labels. The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) has also formulated guidelines to encourage the trade to reduce TFA level in foods and, at the same time, conducted a series of studies to track the TFA contents in local foods. The study revealed that there has been a large reduction in the average TFA contents (27-70% reduction) in four food categories that had been found in previous studies to contain relatively higher levels of TFA (i.e. cakes; egg tart, pie and pastry; bread; and other bakery products), reflecting the positive effect of the trade in reducing TFA level in their products.

From CFS study, it was noted that the TFA contents in some individual samples have reduced dramatically whilst a similar saturated fatty acid contents have been maintained, reflecting that the reduction in TFA without raising the saturated fatty acid contents in foods is practically feasible.

How to reduce the amount of trans fat one eat?

The best ways to reduce the amount of trans fat that you eat are to enjoy healthy eating and choose foods with lower levels of both saturated and trans fat as stated on the nutrition label.

Here are some simple tips for achieving a healthy balanced diet low in saturated and trans fat.

- Use spreads and margarines made from canola, sunflower or olive oil, and dairy blends instead of butter. Spread thinly so you can still see the bread.
- Cook with polyunsaturated or monounsaturated oils, such as canola, sunflower, soybean, olive, sesame and peanut oils. Measure out your oil with a teaspoon or use a spray oil.
- Grill, bake, poach, steam or stir fry rather than shallow or deep frying and roasting in oil.
- Select lean meat, poultry and game. Try to trim all visible fat from the meat before cooking. Remove the skin from chicken.
- Use reduced, low or no fat dairy products.
- Try to limit deep fried foods and fatty take-away foods to no more than once a week.
- Try to limit fatty snacks, such as crisps, cakes, pastries, biscuits and chocolate, to once a week.

Learning Points

Dr. Wong Sai Siong updated the diagnosis, pathophysiology and treatment of Rosacea. He focused on various topical, systemic and light based treatments and introduced the latest topical therapy for Rosacea.

Rosacea is a common chronic inflammatory skin disorder. There are central facial flushing, redness (transient or persistent erythema), papules, pustules, and dilated blood vessels (telangiectasia). Severe cases may have nose enlargement (rhinophyma) or eye/eyelid involvement (ocular rosacea)

Diagnostic criteria (rosacea is a clinical diagnosis)

- Primary features (presence of one or more of the following): transient erythema (flushing), non-transient erythema, papules and pustules, telangiectasia
- **Secondary features** (one or more of the following): burning or stinging, plaque, dry appearance, edema, ocular manifestations, peripheral location, phymatous changes

There are four subtypes 1-Erythemato-telangiectatic 2 – Papulopustular 3- Phymatous 4- Ocular rosacea

Differential diagnoses included acne vulgaris, steroid acne, atopic/contact/seborrhoeic eczema, lupus erythematosus

Treatment

Avoid triggerring factors: UV light, spicy/hot food, alcohol, heat, exercise, stress/anxiety, Demodex mites, steroid (topical/systemic/inhaler/nebulized), topical irritant (make up, facial/mask, creams containing alcohol/ fragrance).

Reduce erythema, papules and pustules by using:

- Topical therapy
- Oral therapy
- Light based therapy

Topical therapy: Topical antibiotics (metronidazole)/ antiacne (azelaic acid)/ antiparasitic (ivermectin) for papules and pustules, topical alpha-adrenergic receptor agonist (brimonidine= Mirvaso) for persistent erythema

Systemic therapy: Systemic antibiotics (tetracycline, doxycycline, lymecycline, clarithromycin) for papules and pustules, ocular rosacea; systemic Isotretinoin for severe resistant cases

Laser therapy: Pulse dye lasers for erythematotelangiectatic rosacea; Intense pulse light (IPL) for erythemato-telangiectatic rosacea; CO2 laser/ pulse dye laser/fractional laser for rhinophyma

Mirvaso gel (Brimonidine gel) is a new topical medication for rosacea

- Topical alpha-2 adrenergic receptor agonist
- Effective for erythema of rosacea,
- No effect for papules, telangiectasia
- Once daily application
- Fast-acting: Effect seen within 30 mins
- Non-permanent: Effect lasts up to 12 hours only
- Consistent effect over 12-months daily use.
- Side effects include flushing/ erythema/ stinging/ worsening redness
