



The lead poisoning incident in Hong Kong - what Family Physicians should know, with links to learn more

Introduction:

Recently there has been a huge public health concern over the incident of lead tainting drinking water in some public housing estates and schools. As family physicians we help the community by identifying potential patients with lead poisoning, doing proper investigations for patients with suspected exposure, triaging cases for referral to medical centres for treatment, as well as educating to the public to alert them of their own potential risk of having lead poisoning. We also need to equip ourselves with updated information on lead poisoning. As the situation is still evolving, we will try to provide useful sources and links for easy updates and on-going referencing.

Lead poisoning can cause harmful effect to humans. It is known that high levels of lead exposure are dangerous however recent evidence also shows that chronic low-level exposure can also have adverse effects in both adults and children. It is believed that children under the age of six are more susceptible to the toxic effects of lead than are adults because they have an incomplete bloodbrain barrier that permits the entry of lead into the developing nervous system. They have higher prevalence of iron deficiency, which is associated with lead poisoning because it may permit increased absorption of lead from the gastrointestinal tract.

Source of lead exposure:

Natural source: lead is a natural heavy metal commonly found in air, soil, dust, food and water.

Artificial source: relatively high concentrations of lead might be found in paint, cosmetics and herbal medicines.

For our situation of contaminated water, it can occur in a number of ways after entering the inside service system of a building. Contamination can occur from old and worn-out internal service systems, and based on the experience of other countries, excessive lead in water can also be caused by the inadvertent illegal use of substandard pipes and fittings.

Clinical features:

• In children:

Low exposure: myalgia/ paresthesia, mild fatigue, irritability, lethargy, occasional abdominal discomfort

Moderate exposure: arthralgia, general fatigue, difficulty concentrating, muscular exhaustibility, tremor, headache, diffuse abdominal pain, vomiting, weight loss, constipation

High exposure: paresis/ paralysis, encephalopathy, colic, lead line (blue-black) on gingival tissue

High blood pressure; abdominal pain; constipation; joint pains; muscle pain; declines in mental functioning; pain, numbness or tingling of the extremities; headache; memory loss; mood disorders; reduced sperm count, abnormal sperm, miscarriage or premature birth in pregnant women

Diagnosis of lead poisoning:

By whole blood lead level testing

	<18 years old, pregnant and lactating women	Adults	
Elevated blood lead level	≥ 5mcg/dl	≥ 10mcg/dl	
High Blood lead level	>44mcg/dl	>50mcg/dl	

Hair and urine tests for lead are not suitable for screening and diagnosis.

Where to consult and refer:

Clinicians can consult the Hong Kong Poison Information Centre (HKPIC) (Tel: 2772 2211) or the Prince of Wales Hospital Poison Treatment Centre (PWHPTC) (Tel: 2632 6209) for advice on clinical evaluation and management.

The Department of Health has set up a hotline for members of the public who suspect they are suffering from lead poisoning on 2125 1122, which operates from 09:00-21:00hrs daily.

我的故事:「我為甚麼要立志成為家庭醫學專科醫生?」

1) 迷失的時期

自小其實很喜歡繪畫,曾想當 一個設計師。但自從有一天之 通了,當人家的設計師,就得依 從人家的框框辦事。對於喜歡 獨立思考去把每件事想通和辦 好的我,那可能不是我想要成 好的我,而且當興趣變成了 工作時,失去了自由再反加了



壓力,我會否從此毀掉了自己唯一的興趣?結果在英國讀中學時最終決定把繪畫和藝術置於一旁,讓它成為我的終生興趣算了。

當時十多歲的我,也會像很多時下的年青人,對於很 多事和前景都很容易迷失,也不知應該立志做什麼。 在十六歲那年的暑假,我在中學的師兄(他當時已畢 業成為眼科醫生)介紹下,回到了香港一間大學醫院 當暑期義工,做了兩個月的內窺鏡部接待員。在內窺 鏡部,每天早上的工作包括為病人登記,處理化驗報 告,也有機會和各部門的醫生談話。他們很好很友 善,明白我的來意後,不僅讓我觀摩他們的內窺鏡檢 查程序,也給予機會入手術室看手術(我記得我見 過的第一個手術是治療十二指腸潰瘍的laparoscopic vagotomy,即腹腔鏡迷走神經切除手術,當年是1995 年。自從大家對peptic ulcer的病理有paradigm shift 以及triple therapy在世上興起後,此種手術的流行度 現已大減)。久而久之,從他人的生活中,我發現其 實行醫可以令自己見識到很多不同的事,應該是很有 趣的生活,所以最後報名入中大讀醫科,最後也有幸 被取錄。

在大學讀醫科的頭三年,每年都會見到有些同學因不 適應此科最後選擇轉系。而同時間,亦有一些同學開 始憧憬自己將會想做個怎樣的醫生時,我卻還沒有任 何確實的方向,感到很迷茫。

2)遇到兩位好「師傅」

我深信從大學教育中,從課堂及書本上便可得到大部分的知識。但說到經驗、做人的處事方式和德行等, 是應該從「師徒制」的實習部分培養出來的。我很高 興擁有過這些學習的機會。

我們大學四年級的「家庭醫學課」除了課堂和習作外,還包括了一些clinical attachments。在機緣際遇下,我被派到兩位「師傅」的診所去觀摩他們的工作。這兩位師傅,各有不同的處事方式,也有不同的

專長。縱然如此,從我眼中的他們,都是友善,令病人覺得可靠,為人設想和知識廣博的人。而正正也因為他們是家庭醫生,所以不同階層、年齡、性別、身份的人也願意去找他們去解決問題和分享自己的事。在他們的日常的診症中,我也看見了病人對他們的respect(尊重)和rapport(良好關係)。

從他們的影子中,我看見了自己可走的方向和前路,我也想成為一個這樣的「家庭醫生」。就這樣,我決定了自己的人生。

3) 專科訓練的路

相信各同袍也會同意,要完成家庭醫學的專科訓練絕對不是一件容易的事。自2003年(沙士的那一年)醫科畢業及完成了一年的實習醫生生活後,我有幸能留在醫管局接受家庭醫學的專科訓練(回想「那些年」職位較近年短缺,能找到一份心儀的工作也不是一件容易的事呢!)。

家庭醫學的專科訓練絕不比其他專科訓練遜色。我們要接受不少於六年的在職專科訓練(首兩年在各醫院專科工作的hospital-based basic training,隨後兩年在社區裡,家庭醫學門診的community-based basic training,及於中期的家庭醫學院院士試完成後的兩年higher training)。以上全部完成才可以再「上戰場」經終極考核(Exit Assessment),獲「家庭醫學專科醫生」,即"Specialist in Family Medicine"的資格。



縱使訓練的道路很艱辛,要「過五關斬六將」,其,間的時光也是非常寶貴的體驗。和其他專科比較快 家庭醫學更着重全面(comprehensive)、連續性 (continuity)、及與人協調(coordinative)的全人照顧(holistic care)。從訓練當中我不單止能加深和鞏固自己的醫學知識,令自己能夠一天比一天有信心去完成每天的診症;於這幾年的工作機會中,我從接觸得到的各式各樣病人和醫院/診所各崗位的同事們令我更明白和他人相處的應有態度,令我更懂得從他人的角度設想,急別人所急(即大家在診証時,也以前更的"I.C.E.",也就是大家常説的英式諺語"think in others' shoes"),及明白團體合作的重要性。所以整體來說,我們專科獨有的訓練令我變了一個比以更更能幹的醫生;而比這更重要的是,我也從中變成更成熟的人。更難能可貴的是,我也從專科訓練的過程中認識了一班在日常工作及專科考試期間互相扶持的好朋友、好同事。

4) 現在的我會怎樣想?

正所謂「人生有幾多個十年?」,當了十一年的家庭醫生及完成了專科訓練和考試的我沒有後悔我行過的路。至今我仍覺得我選擇的道路是正確的。



當一個家庭醫生會令我明白到,我或許無法過一些非常奢華豐裕的生活,而我亦需要持續地努力工作才可照顧我愛的家人,但我感覺到生活是有意義的。而我過去十一年在工作上,也曾經令一些病人生活得更正面和快樂。我也曾有幸實行過自己primary care 的身份,以自己有限的知識,替數個病人診斷過一些及早發現有轉機的隱疾,令他們免除自己的厄運。從他們當中,我也累積了經驗和令自己成長了。

我亦希望各個和我共同每天在工作崗位上奮鬥的同 袍們也沒有感覺到迷失和氣餒,繼續向自己定立的目標前進。雖然我沒有自己的信仰,但我心仍相信世事 皆有定數。之前的一個星期天聽了句頗有意思的説 話,想藉此和大家分享:

"The only difference between stumbling blocks and stepping stones is the way you use them."

(解:「踏腳石」跟「絆腳石」的差別,取決於我們使用的方式。)

我覺得這句説話很有意義。我希望我未來的工作和努力,可化為我身邊病人的「踏腳石」,使他們向自己的健康前進,而不是成為他們的「絆腳石」,令他人感覺困惑。我亦希望當我們為別人刪除他們的「絆腳石」時,我們也同時為自己的路立下「里程碑」(milestones)。

: Dr. Samuel Kent (Acharya Samirkant) graduated from MBBS in 1973 at Gujrat, India; and studied DFM (CUHK) and Diploma in Advance Medicine (CUHK). Dr. Kent has experience in general practice and hospital services in the UK, and spent years in General Psychiatry, St. George's Hospital and the Princess Alexandra Hospital, Harlow, UK.

Since 1981, Dr. Kent has been the Managing Director in his own finance brokerage business in London for nearly 10 years. In 1992, Dr. Kent moved to Hong Kong and worked as a General Practitioner in Tuen Mun. Dr. Kent has had a lifelong interest in family medicine, continuing his education with a special interest in sexual health, and has authored the book "Understanding Sex Problems, The Key To A Happy Marriage!" published in 2005.

Learning Points

It has been some years since we invited Dr. Samuel Kent to speak on this most relevant topic. We previously had both a Professor and Sex Health Therapist speak to us, and now we are able to have the perspective of a family physician.

Dr. Samuel Kent coined the topic "Sexual Health, The Subject Neglected By Family Doctors!" and started with evidence about the need for an increased awareness about sexual health, followed by answering the question why most family doctors avoid addressing sexual health issues, and finally a section on The Way Ahead, Education, Research and potential leadership by the HKCFP.

It is not common for family doctors to enquire about sexual health at the time of first consultation. Yet we all enquire about hypertension, diabetes, BPH, alcohol, smoking, Hepatitis B. The reason we all know well, is that because these problems are all relevant and has a high prevalence [hypertension 24%; Diabetes 9%, B.P.H. 50% at the aged, Smoking among male 16% and among female 4%].

The honest answer

Is there anybody here who is not or has never been interested in sex?

Bogaert of the Department of Community Health Sciences at Brock University surveyed Canadians and found 99% out of 18,000, were interested in having a sexual relationship.

70% are not satisfied.

Read S, King M, and Watson J of the University Department of Psychiatry, Royal Free Hospital School of Medicine, London, answered this question, "Are people satisfied with their sex lives?" and in their paper "Sexual. paper "Sexual dysfunction in primary medical care: prevalence, characteristics and detection by the general practitioner.", they looked at prevalence of sexual dysfunction in primary medical care and concluded that 68% of women and 75% of men were not satisfied with their sex lives, and reported at least one problem with sexual health.

The National Research Council of Milan, looked at prevalence of sexual dysfunction among middle-aged and older adults in 29 countries, collected samples from 27,500 men and women and found 28% of men and 39% of women had encountered at least one episode of sexual dysfunction.

Edward O. Lauman, John H. Gagnon, Robert T. Michael, and Stuart Michaels authored "The Social Organization of Sexuality. Sexual Practice in the U.S." (The University of Chicago Press 1994). The Social Organization of Sexuality reports the complete results of the nation's most comprehensive representative survey of sexual practices in the general adult population of the United States. This highly detailed portrait of sex in America and its social context and implications established a new and original scientific orientation to the study of sexual behavior.

Premature ejaculation

It is persistent or recurrent ejaculation with minimum sexual stimulation before, upon or shortly after penetration or before one wishes it. According to the D.S.M. IV. criteria, its prevalence is 27% - 36%.

Impotence

Feldman HA (1994) found 22% of men by the age of 40 started suffering from some degrees of sexual dysfunction.

Sexual dysfunction and diabetes mellitus

A six-year follow-up study.

Type-I Diabetics:

34% of male suffer from E.D., 31% have low sex desire, 24% of female with reduced lubrication.

Type-II Group:

52% of male had a certain degree of sexual dysfunction, 28% had low sexual desire, 31% had erectile dysfunction



LEARNING POINTS FROM BOARD OF EDUCATION

What is the health seeking behaviour?

Only 1 out of 9 diabetes sufferers seeks help for sexual dysfunction, and it usually takes them at least 6 years before presenting for the first time.

We have now looked at the prevalence rates of some of the major sexual dysfunctions.

We seldom / do not enquire about sexual health, therefore we are neglecting the subject of sexual health.

We need to take careful and detailed history of sexual dysfunction.

Why do we not enquire about sexual health?

The reasons for not consulting physicians included: perception of the subject as a taboo, lack of time, the perceived lack of cost effectiveness, lack of training and communication difficulties.

Where do we go from here?

We need to become proactive, innovative, courageous, and research-oriented.

Dr. Kent suggested several roles for HKCFP: organising training courses, perhaps an interest group in sex health, and also the big potential for research. For example, studies could look at answering this first question:

How to approach patients and attempt to break barriers? Would the use of a standard questionnaire help?

Questionnaire

- Do you agree that everybody wants to be happy?
 Yes / No
- 2. Do you agree that good relationship between man and woman is an important factor which can bring happiness to couple? Yes / No
- Does a satisfying sexual relationship play an important role in establishing and maintaining good relationship in between man and woman? Yes / No
- 4. Do you think people have knowledge about sex problems? Yes / No
- 5. Do you think people know what causes weak sexual performance? Yes / No
- 6. Do you think people with sex problems are too shy to talk to their doctors about their problems? Yes / No
- 7. Do family doctors have a duty to help to improve sexual health of their patients? Yes / No
- 8. Would you like to make an appointment with your doctor to discuss any problem related to sexual health? Yes / No

Conclusion

Dr. Kent shared with the audience his dream, "To bring happiness to the lives of Hong Kong people", advocating this mission to take care of physical, psychological, emotional and sexual problems of our patients.

I see a solo practitioner working on a fundamental element of human life, an area most of us are just beginning to face and there is much to learn.


