As a kind of natural disaster, floods can have great impacts on individuals and the communities with potential sequelae in social, economic and environmental aspects. In fact, the health impacts of floods can include an increase in the communicable diseases transmission, trauma and related injuries, and mental health issues. Floods can pose threats to major infrastructures like water and power supplies. (https://www.racgp.org.au/download/Documents/Disaster/Flooding_Fact-sheet.pdf) My thoughts are with those who have been impacted by the floods, and I firmly believe that our sister College, the RACGP, will play an important leadership role in facilitating the GPs to help and care for the victims and the families affected by the floods. I hope that the flooding in Australia would end soon and people can return to their normal lives.

The Hong Kong Primary Care Conference 2022 has been successfully held between 17th to 19th of June 2022 via the online platform. We have received a total of over 800 delegates registrations this year, including local and overseas colleagues. We are very grateful towards all your participation and support, and the tremendous work of the Organising Committee, the Scientific Committee, Publication Subcommittee, Business Manager, Information Technology Subcommittee, Nurse and Allied Health planners and the College Secretariat. I have received great feedback from participants appreciating the clinical contents of the HKPCC being highly relevant to their

day to day clinical practice. We must continue to strive to better ourselves next year.

The 27th WONCA Europe Conference was held from 28th June to 1st July 2022 in London as a hybrid Conference. I attended the hybrid Meeting of WONCA Council 2022. After a warm welcome by the WONCA President Dr. Anna Stavdal, a series of business reports and council matters were deliberated upon with fruitful outcomes. Many familiar faces showed up in the Council Meeting, including Prof. Amanda Howe, Prof. Michael Kidd, Prof. Donald Li, just to name a few.

The World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) is between 1st and 7th August each year. The theme for this year is "Step up for Breastfeeding - Educate and Support". According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), breastmilk is the ideal food for infants because it is safe, clean and contains antibodies which help protect against many common childhood illnesses. Breastmilk provides all the energy and nutrients that the infant needs for the first months of life, and it continues to provide up to half or more of a child's nutritional needs during the second half of the first year, and up to one third during the second year of life. Breastfed children perform better on intelligence tests, are less likely to be overweight or obese and less prone to diabetes later in life. Women who breastfeed also have a reduced risk of breast and ovarian cancers.

Report on OSCE 2022 Information Seminar for Candidates

The Information Seminar on OSCE segment was held on 12 June 2022 via Zoom Video Webinar platform. In total 42 candidates (Cat I: 35, Cat II: 7) attended the seminar. Members from the Board – including the Chairman, the OSCE Coordinator and the Deputy OSCE Coordinator also attended.

The seminar started with a warm welcome by our Chairman, Dr. Chan Hung Chiu, who first introduced the concept and expectations of our Conjoint Examination. He then explained the various measures undertaken by the Board to ensure that the examination was fair, reliable and valid to all the candidates.

Dr. Loretta Chan (OSCE Coordinator) presented information concerning the examination. One candidate, Dr. Jiao Fangfang, was invited to participate in an 8-minute sample case and Dr. Fu Sau Nga (Deputy OSCE Coordinator) assisted in the role-playing scenario.

We presented the marking scheme and went through the setting of the domains of the case. We also explained the marking rationale behind using essential marking points to divide between pass and fail for a particular domain in each question. The candidates were given a chance to mark the scenario with the respective key feature checklist themselves and understand how to assess a particular domain and how to achieve the pass criteria in each domain.

On the whole the atmosphere was friendly and the candidates were enthusiastic. Feedback forms were distributed and their feedback was positive. Looking at the feedback statistics, most candidates benefited from this seminar and found it very useful. The majority of attendees agreed that the seminar helped their OSCE preparation, and provided useful information regarding how their performance will be assessed.

In summary, the afternoon was fruitful for both the candidates and board members. It is hoped that the additional information provided to the candidates will help to translate their hard work into success in the coming examination!

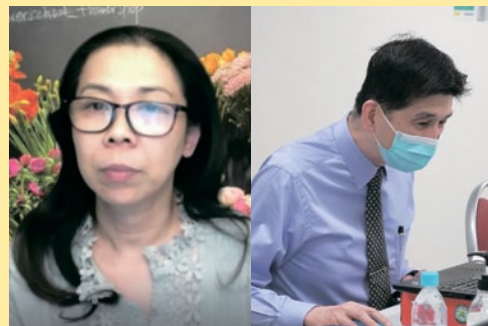

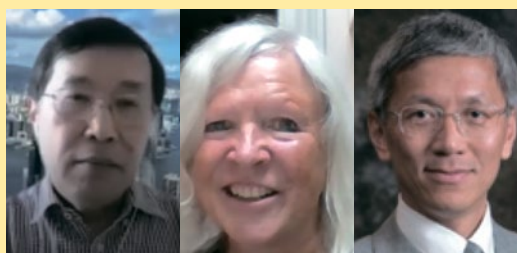

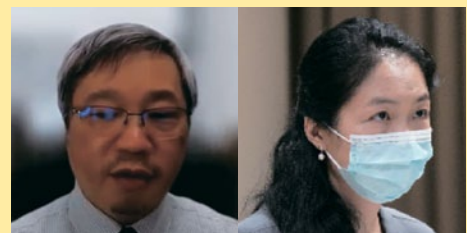

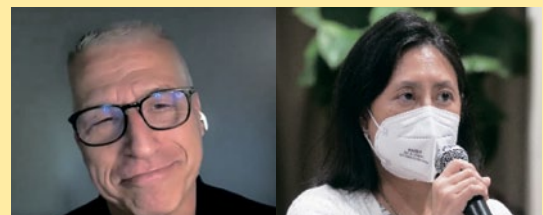

Historical General Out Patient Clinic Series - Shek Wu Hui GOPC

History and Background

Shek Wu Hui has a long history of at least more than 200 years. (The name could be found in 清朝嘉慶版1819《墟市》in《新安縣志》:「石湖扇墟,舊誌天崗,今移石湖」) It was a small scale market in the past. It later had undergone a large scale reconstruction after two destructive fire in 1955 and 1956. After the fire the city was re-planned and reconstructed as a more organised commercial market.

With the rising population since the post-war period, it had led to crowded living conditions and the rapid spread of infectious diseases. As public health resources were stretched to the limit, the ex-Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club made a number of donations in the 1950s to construct or expand hospitals, maternity wards, and treatment centres, as well as operate over 20 Jockey Club clinics and two floating clinics.

Located in Sheung Shui, Shek Wu Hui Jockey Club General Outpatient Clinic (石湖墟賽馬會普通科門診診所) was one of the historical Jockey Club Clinics in Hong Kong, serving the population for over half a century. It was established in 1961 and was named Jockey Club Clinic, Shek Wu Hui (賽馬會石湖墟診療所), with HK\$670,000 of ex-Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club's funding and a piece of land donated by the Sheung Shui Land Investment Company Limited. This old style 3-storey building housed the general outpatient clinic, dispensary, maternity ward and quarters for medical staff in the past.

Current building

Shek Wu Hui Jockey Club Clinic is currently a building complex of different medical centres, owned by Department of Health. There are General Outpatient Clinic (GOPC) and Methadone Clinic on the Ground Floor, Chest Clinic and Elderly Health Centre on the First Floor, and Student Health Service Centre on the Second Floor. And only GOPC is run by Hospital Authority since July 2003.

Current services:

- episodic consultations and chronic diseases consultations. Service Performance in the year 2019/2020: GOPC Doctor attendance was around 110,000
- Travelling dispensary: we have clinic services to help patients who live near north border like Sha Tau Kok and Ta Kwu Ling
- Dressing/ injections and vaccinations
- Smoking Cessation Programme: multidisciplinary team approach to provide assessment and management of smoking cessation, including professional counselling, follow up services and pharmacotherapy if needed

Tobacco Endgame

According to the latest figures from the thematic household survey No.75 conducted by The Census and Statistics Department, Hong Kong's smoking prevalence fell from 10.2 percent in 2019 to 9.5 percent in 2021, marking the first time on record that the percentage dropped to single digit.

In conjunction with over 190 representatives of various sectors of the society, COSH (Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health) had introduced the "Charter on Tobacco Endgame" in April 2022 to jointly advocate for tobacco endgame strategies in Hong Kong and strengthening tobacco control measures, appealing for further reducing the smoking prevalence to 5% or below, and then ban smoking to terminate the tobacco epidemic. As we can see, "Tobacco Endgame" is a relatively new concept that goes beyond tobacco control, and aiming to ban smoking and end the tobacco epidemic by strengthening tobacco control efforts. Suggested measures including but not limited to (1) tobacco tax increase; (2) expansion of statutory no smoking areas; (3) point-of-sale tobacco product displays; (4) plain packaging; (5) raising legal age of tobacco purchase; (6) reducing attractiveness and addictiveness of tobacco products; (7) license of tobacco sale; (8) legal onus of venue manager for smoking offenses; (9) Tightened enforcement; (10) More resources for smoke-free education and smoking cessation; and (11) Preventing tobacco industry's interference.

Some examples of Foreign Tobacco Endgame Strategies

- **The "Tobacco 21" Law in US** - On Dec. 20, 2019, the US President signed legislation amending the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, and raising the federal minimum age for sale of tobacco products from 18 to 21 years. This legislation (known as "Tobacco 21" or "T21") became effective immediately, and it is now illegal for a retailer to sell any tobacco product—including cigarettes, cigars, and e-cigarettes—to anyone under 21. The new federal minimum age of sale applies to all retail establishments and persons with no exceptions.

- **Finland 2030** - The Tobacco Act of 2010 declared that it would put an end to the use of tobacco products in Finland. There was no target date but Savuton Suomi, a civil society movement for a tobacco-free Finland, challenged the Finnish government to make it 2040 and they accepted the goal. There were then further reports that the Finnish government were to bring the target forward 10 years to 2030.
- **New Zealand 2025** - In New Zealand, the Tupeka Kore (tobacco-free) vision was launched by a range of concerned NGOs and advocacy groups in 2009. This proposed a target and a series of interventions to achieve close to zero tobacco smoking prevalence by 2020. Subsequently, the Māori Affairs Parliamentary Select Committee released a report recommending that New Zealand should be smoke-free by 2025, and the Government has since affirmed support for this goal.
- **Ireland 2025** - The Irish Government tobacco strategy contained 60 recommendations to significantly reduce smoking over the next 12 years. They defined a "tobacco-free" Ireland as one where less than five per cent of the population smoke.

Our Current Local Situation

Locally, despite that currently, Hong Kong has yet formulated an endgame plan or strategy to ban smoking, the government has already launched the "Towards 2025: Strategy and Action Plan to Prevent and Control Non-communicable Diseases in Hong Kong" with a target to reduce the smoking prevalence by 30% relative to the 2010 prevalence to 7.8% by 2025, in accordance with the "Global Action Plan for the Prevention and Control of Non-communicable Diseases 2013-2020" by the World Health Organization. Hopefully with the additional enforcement by COSH's new charter in April 2022, a more concrete timetable and roadmap for achieving the Tobacco Endgame will be formulated by the Government towards a healthier, smoke-free Hong Kong.

Family Medicine Career Talk 2022

The Young Doctors Committee (YDC) has been organizing career talks for our medical graduates and students since 2018. Being one of the annual flagship events of the YDC, there were 113 participants joined the talk this year on 27th May from 6:30pm to 9:00pm. Due to the unprecedented challenges of COVID-19, we have moved the talk to online platform since 2020. The talk was moderated by the YDC co-chairmen Dr. Chan Chi Wai and Dr. Thomas Dao, with the aims to introduce the training programme offered by our College, the assessment methods, post-specialist development and most importantly the life as a family physician in different sectors. We are honored to have our College President Dr. David Chao and many of our YDC members working in the public, private, NGO and academic field joining the event.

Dr. Chao started the event by delivering an insightful welcoming speech. Dr. Lau Ka Man and Dr. Cathy Lo introduced the basic training and the conjoint exam, while Dr. Aldo Wong and Dr. Cherlyle Chan introduced the higher training and the exit exam. Dr. Charis Ng then shared with us the post-specialist development and her experiences

in the Hospital Authority and NGO. Dr. Sara Chan and Dr. Chloe Chan shared with us some interesting cases encountered during their daily work in private hospital and private clinic respectively. Dr. Emily Tse shared her work as an academician in Family Medicine. Following the presentation came the Q&A session. Our speakers and other YDC members participated in the discussion and cleared many queries from the interns and students regarding the training and career prospects in family medicine. After the talk, we received 19 applications for student membership and 22 registrations to the HKPCC, the annual scientific conference of our College.

We have also asked our participants to fill in a post-talk questionnaire as an evaluation of our talk. We received 40 returns (response rate 35.4%). The participants had more understanding of the primary care in Hong Kong, the role of family physicians in the health care system, training and assessment method and the career prospect after the talk. Most of the respondents were satisfied with the arrangement on Zoom, the duration and the content of the career talk. The result is summarized in Table 1 and Table 2.

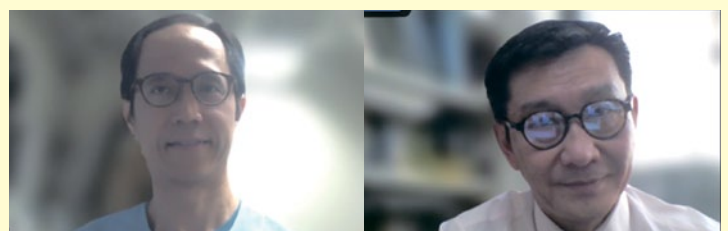
