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### Message from the President

WONCA World Conference 2023 is being hosted by the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) from 26 to 29 October at Sydney's International Convention Centre. The conference has been themed around recovery, reconnection and revival in primary care. WONCA 2023 aims at providing an unique opportunity to connect and network with local and international General Practice colleagues. It promises to offer a dynamic programme to share research and build best practice, encompassing accredited activities, pre-conference workshops, clinical skills updates, CPR workshops and sessions for practice owners. The Hong Kong College of Family Physicians (HKCFP) has decided to bid for hosting the WONCA World Conference 2027. Since the establishment of our College in 1977, it has been our objective to promote and coordinate training, set practice standards and conduct research and development activities in relation to family medicine. In 1987, the HKCFP hosted the first international congress of Family Medicine/ General Practice ever organised in Hong Kong, namely WONCA Regional Conference Asia Pacific Region, and it was attended by over 500 delegates from 35 countries around the globe. In 1995, our College hosted the 14<sup>th</sup> WONCA World Conference (I was most honoured to be involved in the Conference at the time) which was well attended by over 2,500

delegates. Again in 2009, the College hosted the WONCA Regional Conference Asia Pacific Region, despite being under the threat of the Swine Flu at the time, HKCFP received over 800 attendees from 35 countries.



Over the past decades. the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians has been at the core of the Asia Pacific Region to facilitate a platform for collaboration, where ideas are shared, and connections are made. Hong Kong's strategic location, world-class infrastructure, and outstanding hospitality make it the perfect host city for WONCA World Conference in 2027. From the moment you arrive, you will be immersed in a rich cultural experience, where East meets West.

May in Hong Kong is comfortably warm and there are many excellent modern state-of-the-art meeting venues for medical conferences. Hong Kong is well established as a popular holiday destination with a highly acclaimed and efficient service-oriented hospitality industry.

The year 2027 marks the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians. With HKCFP's proven track record in hosting WONCA conferences, I have every confidence that the 2027 WONCA World Conference in Hong Kong will be another great success to celebrate this important milestone with the global family medicine community. Voting will be conducted in October during the WONCA World Conference in Sydney. Please give HKCFP your full support and wish HKCFP all the best! As mentioned previously, the Chronic Disease Co-Care Pilot Scheme will be commenced by the Health Bureau in November 2023. (<a href="https://www.primaryhealthcare.gov.hk/en/">https://www.primaryhealthcare.gov.hk/en/</a>) Patients with Diabetes Mellitus (DM) and hypertension are the main target groups. Citizens aged 45 or above without a known diagnosis of DM or hypertension will be eligible for enrolment in a subsidised screening programme with

access to investigations and supported by a family doctor from the Primary Care Directory. Healthy participants will be offered Education regarding a healthy lifestyle and the opportunity to undergo repeat screening every 3 years. People with prediabetes, DM, and/or hypertension will receive subsidised care, laboratory support for monitoring, from their paired family doctor and a multidisciplinary team in the community. Another important objective of the Scheme is to build a pool of Primary Care Registry registered family doctors who are devoted to delivering quality primary care for the Hong Kong citizens. The ultimate goals of the Scheme are to shift populationlevel health-seeking behaviour from treatmentoriented to prevention-focused, to encourage shared responsibility for personal health at an affordable cost, to enable family doctors to maintain continuity of care, and to improve health for all. The HKCFP fully supports that.

### 2024 Full Exit Examination of Vocational Training in Family Medicine

The Specialty Board is pleased to announce the following information on the 2024 Full Exit Examination of Vocational Training in Family Medicine.

#### **ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENT**

Applicants must fulfill the following criteria:

- a. Full or limited registration with the Hong Kong Medical Council
- b. Being active Fellows, or Members (Full or Associate) of the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians (HKCFP)
- c. Fulfill the CME / CPD requirements under HKCFP Quality Assurance Program in the preceding year
- d. Have a qualification in family medicine / general practice; which is recognized by the HKCFP and the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM)
- e. Had completed higher training in Family Medicine; **OR expected to do so by February 29, 2024**; as certified / approved by the Board of Vocational Training and Standards (BVTS), HKCFP.

The relevant approval may take up to two months, therefore applicants are recommended to apply early to BVTS for

- + Certification of completion of higher training OR
- + Recommendation to sit for Exit Examination 2024
- f. Active in clinical practice and able to meet the requirements of individual Exit Examination segments:
  - + Clinical Audit: the starting date must be within 3 years before the exam application deadline
  - + Research: the date of ethics approval must be within 3 years before the exam application deadline
  - + Practice Assessment: submit valid Practice Management Package (PMP) report
- g. From Full Exit Examination 2019 onwards, candidates must have presented their Research or Clinical Audit proposals or completed studies at Research & Clinical Audit Forum before the application deadline of Exit Examination

Eligibility to enroll in Exit Examination is subject to the final approval of the Specialty Board, HKCFP. Application will be processed only if all the required documents are submitted with the examination application form.

### **ELECTION TO FELLOWSHIP OF THE HONG KONG ACADEMY OF MEDICINE**

Candidates should be aware that passing the Exit Examination does not equate to election to Fellowship of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Please refer to the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Fellowship Handbook or consult the Specialty Board, HKCFP on the criteria for election to Fellowship of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (Family Medicine).

#### **FORMAT AND CONTENTS**

Exit Examination consists of three segments. Candidates are required to take all the three segments at their first attempt of the Exit Examination. Non-compliance is subject to disqualification.

Candidate can choose to attempt either Clinical Audit or Research segment.

+ Clinical Audit: assesses the candidate's knowledge, skills and attitudes in critical appraisal of information, selfaudit, quality assurance and continuous professional improvement

#### OF

+ **Research:** assesses the candidate's ability to conduct a research project which includes: performing literature search and defining a research question, selecting the most appropriate methodology to answer the research question, performing appropriate analysis and interpreting the results with a discussion and conclusion

#### AND

+ **Practice Assessment:** assesses the candidate's knowledge, application of skills and ability to organize and manage an independent family medicine practice

#### AND

+ Consultation Skills Assessment: assesses the candidate's knowledge, skills and attitude in communication, problem solving, working with families and management in different types of family medicine consultations

### The Diary of a Family Doctor【家庭醫生的日常】

### 既是醫生,又是「導師」

在每年七月,我們的家庭醫學部都會有一批新醫科畢業生完成醫院實習後加入我們的團隊。今年,我也像往常一樣,被委派成為一位初級訓練醫生(basic trainee)的指導者(trainer)。



雖然不經不覺,已經有約十年當指導者的經驗,每次新同事的培訓仍然讓我感到挑戰。醫學生在醫學院內學到的是理論和知識,但新醫生必須把這些學到的知識實際應用在臨床上。我的責任是協助新同事順利地過渡這

個過程。首週要讓新同事迅速了解診所的環境和硬件設備,再介紹臨床醫療管理系統(Clinical Management System)的使用竅門,隨後衍生的例如如何從病人的「奇難雜症」中得出合理的結論和診斷,如何處理有問題的化驗報告,應對病人情緒和特殊要求,掌控時間完成工作等等。雖然多年的實戰經驗已令我積累了不少歷練,短時間內把所知所見過的一切以「邊診症,邊傳承」[see one, do one, teach one]的方式解説,其實比自己親手全包辦更疲累,更費神。所有這些都是為了確保新同事不必重蹈我「從痛苦中學習」的經歷,順利地進入未來的工作中,於新崗位學懂於工作間承擔更多的責任。

這種師徒式的學習模式代代相傳。畢竟自己也只是常人,做事總有缺點和盲點,希望不會無意間傳授不良習慣,誤導後人。其後數月於定期觀察同事的診症(sit-in consultations)以及個案回顧(case reviews)也會令自己得益不少,每當給予他人意見時,往往也會讓自己溫故知新並發掘到自我改進空間。教學相長,讓自己成長。

Primary Care Directory (PCD), implemented and administered by the Primary Healthcare Office of the Health Bureau, is a web-based database set up to facilitate the public to search for suitable primary care service providers according to their practice information.

### The Primary Healthcare Blueprint

PCD is required for family doctors and healthcare professionals enrolling in Government-subsidised primary healthcare initiatives for standardization and assurance of quality of primary healthcare services.

From 6 October 2023, doctors will be required to be enlisted in PCD in order to enrol in Government-subsidised Primary Healthcare (PHC) programmes

















### "Family Doctor for All"

All members of the public to each be paired with a family doctor of their own for development of personalised care plan

### **Entry Requirements of PCD**

- Registered medical practitioners with valid practising certificates
- Committed to the provision of directly accessible, comprehensive, continuing and co-ordinated person-centred primary care services



General practitioners (GP) and specialists are both welcome to join PCD. For specialists, their status as specialists can be shown in the PCD. Doctors (GP and specialists) can also choose to provide their professional qualifications in the PCD for public reference.

### **Maintaining Listing in PCD**

Upon successful listing in the PCD, doctors have to comply with the relevant requirement in order to maintain listing in the PCD, particularly on accumulation of adequate Continuing Medical Education (CME) points.

### **Hospital Authority Outstanding Team Award 2023:**

Family Medicine and Primary Health Care Anti-COVID-19 Pandemic Team

In Hospital Authority (HA), there are 16 clinical Coordinating Committees (COCs) that mirror the inaugural colleges at Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM). Coordinating Committee in Family Medicine COC (FM) is one of the 16 committees, comprising 21 members nominated from 7 Clusters, including Chief of Service (COS) and 2 senior clinicians from each cluster. COC (FM) serves as an important link between clinical governance and corporate governance, facilitating clinicians' input to address operational and planning issues in HA. We have specific roles in setting service standards, developing clinical practice guidelines, workforce training, conducting clinical audits, managing clinical risks and introducing new technology and service development.

Since the emergence and along waves of COVID-19 pandemic, Family Medicine and Primary Health Care Departments across all 7 Clusters have contributed in pandemic prevention and control on all fronts by coordinating and supporting various COVID-19-related services in FM and General Out-patient Clinic (GOPC) settings, dovetailing Government's anti-

epidemic strategies in combating COVID-19. COC (FM) has therefore taken the lead to coordinate the bidding of "Hospital Authority Outstanding Team Award 2023". We hope the efforts of our 2500 staff could be recognized and we are very pleased to be chosen as one of the 10 Outstanding Teams this year. It is indeed an unforgettable moment when we got the Award together with different colourful signboards from 7 clusters on stage.



FM Team in HA is serving 1.5 million patients with 6 million attendances annually at 73 GOPCs for decades. When battling against COVID-19, promptly, we further enhance our role as patients' first point of medical contact as gatekeeper of the hospitals and health-keeper of people outside hospitals.

To prevent contracting the disease and disease complications, we assisted the territory wide vaccination programmes and provided nearly 407,000 doses of vaccines. To address patients' worries about the vaccines,

we also set up "Vaccine Assessment Clinics" to answer enquiries about the vaccinations. Altogether, we served about 8000 GOPC chronic patients for this purpose.



In order to enhance early testing and detection of COVID, we ordered nearly 620,000 compulsory tests. We also distributed about 3,600,000 specimen collection packs for the Enhanced Laboratory Surveillance (ELS) programme.







When the fifth wave of COVID-19 pandemic hit Hong Kong hard in early 2022, where tens of thousands of new cases were reported daily, confirmed cases were triaged to different service outlets according to their clinical conditions. With aims to support COVID-19 patients in the community with relatively mild symptoms requiring medical advice, especially high risk patients (including elderly, children aged 5 or below, women at 28 or more weeks of pregnancy, and immunocompromised patients), Designated Clinics for COVID-19 Confirmed Cases (DCs) were activated since 16 February 2022. With early planning and full preparedness, the concerted team efforts from our colleagues and various departments across Head Office and Clusters, DCs were activated and scaled up in phases, within 48 hours upon direction of the Central Command Committee. During the peak of pandemic from mid-March to mid-May 2022, 23 DCs were in operation, providing capacity of 4,300 quotas per day. From 12 March 2022 onward, antivirals, namely Molnupiravir and Paxlovid, had been appropriately prescribed to needy patients.

Along the journey combating COVID-19, with aims to enhance the accessibility of high risk patients in the community to DC service, as well as the booking arrangement, FM launched the online booking platform



- "Book Tele/DC" app and prioritised quotas to high risk groups by introducing "Care Booking Line", allocating priority quotas for these patients via app booking and establishing referral mechanism with Patient Support Call Centre (PSCC).







In response to the significant rebound of the fifth wave in mid-2022, DC service was further enhanced by integrating tele-consultation element with aligned operational flow building on the experience of HA Tele Health Hub starting from late July 2022, where teams of committed

and innovative FM colleagues from all 7 Clusters, including clinical staff and clerical / supporting staff, managed to expand the service capacity to over 1,000 tele-consultation daily quotas in less than a month's time, overcoming all sorts of limitations. Since DC activation, DC has delivered over >506,000 attendances (~295,000 being in-person consultations, ~211,000 being tele-consultations), with exceptionally low referral rates to AED observed (< 0.5%, i.e.

~ 2000 cases), recognising the gatekeeping role of FM in supporting confirmed patients in the community. Admittedly, DC and its teleconsultation service is an important, if not indispensable part of the antiepidemic efforts in the territory. FM colleagues continuously serve the community with perseverance with aims to alleviate the pressure of public healthcare system by activating DCs and tele-DCs, while maintaining essential service for members of the public, especially those with chronic diseases.

### **Travel Medicine at a glance**

Nowadays, people travel all around the world after global transportations have been resumed. I personally encountered more travel related consultations. I would like to share some useful information.

### Scenario 1: Doctor, I am going to Africa to see animals

The first thing I will check with client is whether Yellow Fever is compulsory for this trip. Yellow Fever vaccination is only available in Department of Health Travel Clinic.

If Yellow Fever vaccination is a prerequisite for entry to a country, I will direct my client to Travel Clinic.

#### Yellow Fever Vaccination schedule

The vaccination comprises a single subcutaneous injection administered from the age of 9 months onwards. The vaccine provides lifelong protection.

Travellers should remember that the certificate is valid only 10 days after the vaccine is given and the first dose of vaccine takes 10 days to provide good protection therefore adequate time should be allowed for vaccination before departure.

#### Recommendations

Yellow fever is endemic in some tropical areas of Africa and Latin America. The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends immunisation for all travellers aged 9 months and above, travelling to and from at-risk areas, unless they are contraindicated for vaccination.

Yellow fever is the only disease specified in the International Health Regulations (2005) (IHR (2005)) for which countries may require proof of vaccination from travellers as a condition of entry under certain circumstances. Please refer to the list of countries with risk of yellow fever transmission and countries requiring yellow fever vaccination issued by WHO. The list is updated by WHO regularly. The latest list can be searched by entering 'yellow fever transmission' at the field of 'Search by keyword' at the website below: https://www.who.int/publications/m

Following the amendment to the IHR (2005) on 11 July 2016, currently valid certificates continue to be valid for the life of the traveller indicated. Existing certificates do not need to be changed or modified to show they are valid for life.

#### Adverse reactions

Side effects of the vaccine are generally mild. Only 5-10% of recipients will experience headache, muscle ache, low-grade fever as well as redness and swelling at the injection site. Immediate hypersensitive reactions such as urticaria or anaphylactic shock are extremely rare.

#### Precautions

Travellers with the following health conditions may not be suitable to receive yellow fever vaccination. Before receiving the vaccine, travellers should consult doctor's advice:

- Having a febrile illness
- Persons who are allergic to eggs or to any of the vaccine components
- Pregnant and breastfeeding women
- Infants under 9 months old
- Persons aged 60 years and older
- Persons on immunosuppressive treatment or having radiotherapy
- Persons with immunosuppressive diseases such as lymphoma, thymoma, leukaemia, Hodgkin's disease, hypogammaglobulinaemia and HIV infection
- Received other live attenuated viral vaccines within the past 4 weeks

Special notes for travellers aged 60 years and older

Travellers aged 60 years and older, who receive yellow fever vaccine for the first time, are at greater risk of serious side effects following vaccination. These serious side effects include:

#### Viscerotropic disease

- Risk is at least 1-2 / 100,000
- Characterized by severe multi-organ failure
- Overall case-fatality rate is high

### Neurotropic disease (e.g. meningoencephalitis, acute disseminated encephalomyelitis and Guillain-Barré Syndrome)

- Risk is at least 1-2 / 100,000
- Serious but seldom fatal

### Scenario 2: Doctor, I am going to go swimming in my holiday, I want to delay my menses

My personal choice is Norethisterone. My instruction would be taking 5mg three times a day starting 3 days before she is expecting her period. This medication should be taken for no longer than 20 days. Once a client stops taking Norethisterone, period should occur within 2 to 3 days and cycle should continue as usual. However, this method only applies to those having regular cycles.

### Scenario 3: Doctor, do I need to have malaria prophylaxis?

I will discuss with clients the details of itinerary. They would go to rural area or just stay inside hotels likely?

I would search the destination with CDC Travelers' Health website to offer suggestion whether malaria prophylaxis is needed and which medication would be suggested.

### **LEARNING POINTS FROM BOARD OF EDUCATION**

# 21<sup>st</sup> Meeting for Interest Group in Medical Humanities held on 5 August 2023 (Saturday)

Topic : Philosophical Counselling - Case Sharing

Philosophical counselling simply means counselling with a philosophical approach, but how does it differ from other counselling skills? Philosophical counselling mainly focuses on more basic parts of our thinking, like our beliefs, values and views of life and world. It also focuses on the thinking process with challenges on the logic behind our beliefs. The two prerequisites of philosophical counselling are the transformation of client's problem to philosophical problem; and client's willingness and ability to philosophise with the counsellor.

In this session we have discussed three cases to illustrate the essence of this approach.

#### Case 1:

A university year 3 student had an unplanned pregnancy with her boyfriend, enquired about whether she should about or not

In this case the first thing is the morality of abortion. This is a long-lasting debate in philosophy as it also involves many issues in other fields like medicine, law and sociology. In philosophy we mainly focus on the definition of personhood with regard to the fetus, as if a fetus is a person, then abortion is murder. Therefore, we needed to discuss with the client her view on this aspect.

Another issue in this case is whether it is good to be born. It involves the discussion of anti-natalism. One of the approaches is the asymmetry argument by David Benatar on the calculation of pain and pleasure if a person is born or not.

Final discussion point is whether the soul exists or not. As one of the client's fears was that if the fetus has a soul, and if she aborts (that means she kills it, if she takes the fetus as personhood), would the fetus's soul come back for revenge? This involves the discussion of mind-body dualism.

Finally, this student aborted WITH HER JUSTIFICATION (after all the discussion) and restarted a new relationship.

#### Case 2:

A 20+-year-old lady wanted to move out with her boyfriend as she had difficulty living with her mom, but she was worried of this act is disobedience to parents (不孝).

Firstly, we discussed with client about 'obedience to parents' (孝順). What is her definition of 「孝順」? Is it equal to 'living together'? Is 'not living together' equal to 「不孝」? This discussion is also related to our culture as we are living in a mix of Chinese and Western cultures.

Another important issue was her relationship with her mother. We are often bound by our roles in the world. Everyone has many roles once born, and each role has certain responsibilities and expectations. One of the problems for this client was her 'near perfectionistic' expectation of her mom. And one of the reactions to her failed expectation from her mom was rebellion. In the counselling we hoped to 'correct' this perfectionistic expectation and her acceptance of her mom as an ordinary woman with faults. Following the change in expectation, her attitude towards her mom would change and the relationship would improve afterwards.

Finally, this lady moved out with her boyfriend, and changed her attitude towards her mom, and their relationship was better than before.

#### Case 3:

A university philosophy student was failing in his study with depression. This student had been promoted to university via associate degree. He had problem submitting a thesis in his study and he faced disqualification from university as he got a GPA of 0.7. He liked philosophy and was arrogant that he wanted to be a 'great philosopher', but at the end of term he would have hypersomnia and loss of motivation, as a result he was unable to submit a thesis for the assessment.

Upon further exploration, the counsellor found the underlying reason for his entering university, studying philosophy and wanting to be a great philosopher was actually his low self-image on behalf of his parents. He wanted to appear 'successful' in front of them and not to be 'looked down'. In this case all that he was doing is just a 'mean' (or instrumental end), but not an 'end' (or ultimate end). When he mixed up the mean and the end, then he would be tortured by the failure in the only means. The aim of philosophical counselling would be to help him to realize what is his 'ultimate end/ aim', and once he identified his ultimate end, he could explore other means to achieve it.

Finally, the student quit studying philosophy, changed to be a flight attendant, earned money for his parents and gained back the 'respect' from his parents and built up his self-image.

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
