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Message from the President

The WONCA World Conference 2025 is to be held in Lisbon, Portugal from 17th to 21st September 2025 and the theme of the conference is "New vision for primary health care and sustainable development". The organiser recently announced that there would be over 3500 participants from 114 countries joining the conference. Our College's Chief Censor, Prof Cindy Lam, has been invited to be one of the keynote speakers for the coming conference and she will be delivering her talk entitled, "AI & Family Medicine - The Human Touch of Primary Care, Art is Long", on 21st September from 10:15 to 10:45. (https:// www.woncaworld2025.org/keynote-speakers) There will also be active participation by HKCFP Fellows and members in seminars, oral and e-poster presentations. Do come and join us as part of the HKCFP delegation!

Chikungunya fever, a mosquito-borne viral disease caused by the Chikungunya virus, has been found in over 110 countries in Africa, Asia, Europe, the Americas and islands in the Indian and Pacific Oceans, according to Centre of Health Protection (CHP). (https://www.chp.gov.hk/en/healthtopics/content/24/6122.html) As of August 1, there were more than 7 200 cases in Foshan. The majority of cases (6 230 cases) were concentrated in Shunde District of Foshan. All cases were mild, with no severe or fatal cases. A smaller number of confirmed cases were also recorded in other cities in Guangdong Province. In Macao SAR, six imported cases and two local cases were identified since mid-

Therefore, it is important to enquire about recent travel history when seeing patients with suspected vector borne diseases.



The commonest mode of transmission of Chikungunya fever is through the bites of infective female Aedes mosquitoes. Locally, the vector Aedes aegypti is not found, but Aedes albopictus, which can also spread the disease, is a mosquito commonly found in Hong Kong. These mosquitoes may have peaks of activity in the early morning and late afternoon but they can be biting throughout the day. Once bitten, the incubation period commonly lasts for 3 to 8 days, but it can range from 2 to 12 days. (https://www.chp.gov.hk/en/healthtopics/content/24/6122.html)

The disease is characterised by fever and debilitating joint pain and other common signs and symptoms include muscle pain, headache, nausea, fatigue and rash. The symptoms are usually self-limiting and last for a few days, while in some cases joint pain may persist for several months, or even years. Rarely would patients affected by Chikungunya fever have severe symptoms and deaths from Chikungunya are rare. Occasionally, severe complications of the eye, heart and nerves can happen with the infection. Higher risk group for more severe disease include

newborns, elders or patients with underlying medical conditions. Patients who have been infected before are likely to be immune from future Chikungunya virus infections according to available evidence.

Treatment is mainly supportive, including using anti-pyretics, analgesics and replacement of fluids. There is currently no targeted antiviral treatment for Chikungunya fever. The best preventive measure is to avoid mosquito bites and prevent mosquito proliferation. There is no locally registered Chikungunya fever vaccine available in Hong Kong at present.

Prevention of mosquito bites plays an important role in fighting against the disease, which includes wearing loose, light-coloured, long-sleeved tops and trousers, applying DEET-containing insect repellent on exposed parts of the body and clothing, taking additional preventive measures when engaging in outdoor activities like avoid using fragrant cosmetics or skin care products, re-apply insect repellent according to instructions, if both insect repellent and sunscreen are used, apply insect repellent after sunscreen. Preventing mosquito proliferation is also important, helping to stop the spread of the disease. That entails preventing accumulation of stagnant water, controlling vectors and reservoir of diseases.

As family doctors, we should maintain high vigilance against Chikungunya fever and CHP has reminded that all patients with compatible clinical presentations and a recent travel history to areas with current outbreak or endemic areas should be reported to the Central Notification Office (CENO) of the CHP by fax (2477 2770), by phone (2477 2772), or via the CENO On-line website (https://cdis.chp.gov.hk/CDIS_CENO_ONLINE/ceno.html). The 38th Fellowship Conferment Ceremony of the Hong Kong College of Family Physicians (HKCFP) and the 35th Dr. Sun Yat Sen Oration were successfully held on Sunday, 13 July 2025, at the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Building in Wong Chuk Hang.

As one of the most important events of the College, we were honoured by the presence of government officials, representatives from universities, sister colleges from overseas, the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, and local specialty colleges who participated in celebrating the joyful success of our Conjoint Fellows and our successful candidates in the Exit Examination and Diploma in Family Medicine (DFM) on this auspicious occasion.

DOCTORS - TRUSTED PARTNERS IN REDUCING ALCOHOL HARM

A major health and social problem

The importance of alcohol as a major risk factor for non-communicable diseases (NCDs) is evidenced by its inclusion in the World Health Organization's Global Action Plan for the Prevention and Control of NCDsⁱ as one of four major behavioural (that is, modifiable) risk factors, others being tobacco use, unhealthy diet and physical inactivity. These risks drive metabolic changes like high blood pressure, obesity, and elevated blood glucose, which in turn fuel NCDs.

Globally, NCDs accounted for 59.5% of all deaths in 2000, rising to 73.9% in 2019 before coming down as COVID-19 started to take a toll on human lives. It is estimated that, in 2019, 2.6 million deaths worldwide were attributable to alcohol consumption, affecting 2 million men and 0.6 million women. People of younger age (20–39 years) are disproportionately affected.

According to the Department of Health's Health Behaviour Survey 2023, about one in ten persons aged 15 or above consumed alcohol regularly at least once a week in the past year, which was more common in men than women. About 2.7% adults engaged in monthly binge drinking defined as consuming five or more drinks in one sitting, and 4.1% drank at increased risk, experienced harmful drinking or probable alcohol dependenceⁱⁱⁱ.

Alcohol and alcoholic beverages contain ethanol, which is a psychoactive and toxic substance with dependence-producing properties. Alcohol consumption plays a causal role in more than 200 diseases, injuries and other health conditions including liver diseases, heart diseases, cancers as well as mental health and behavioural issues such as depression, anxiety and alcohol use disorders. Alcohol is an established carcinogen implicated in breast, liver, head and neck, oesophageal and colorectal cancers. Alcohol use affects the

incidence or outcome of infectious diseases such as tuberculosis and HIV and, during pregnancy, increases the risk of foetal alcohol spectrum disorders. Often unrecognised and under-reported, alcohol use causes harm to others by way of injuries, road traffic accidents, partner violence, child abuse, sexual assault and absenteeism from work. Between 2007 and 2022, over 2000 annual hospital admissions were recorded due to alcohol-related conditions consisting of mental and behavioural disorders (75%) and alcoholic liver disease (25%). Hospitalizations for heart diseases, stroke, cancer, injuries and other conditions attributed to alcohol use have not, however, been accounted for.

Look for the problem and act on it

In general practice, one seldom sees "a patient requesting specific advice for his or her drinking problem". The drinker may more likely be a young man with hypertension and weight concern, a manual worker with gouty arthritis, a housewife with sleep problem, an office lady with depressive symptoms or a lad with a bruised eyebrow. Drinkers may not see a need to seek medical advice for their drinking behaviour either because they are unaware of the harm related to drinking or they may feel inappropriate or embarrassed to raise the matter during consultation. In the latter scenario, promotion of 'socially responsible drinking' by the alcohol industry probably adds to this stigma.

Yet, an encounter with the doctor offers an ideal opportunity to educate patients about alcohol risk and reduce alcohol harm. Using Screening and Brief Intervention (SBI)^{iv} as a public health strategy (similar to conducting a wellness check for smoking, diet and exercise behaviour) helps identify people who drink excessively and prompts the doctor to offer quick, non-judgmental and effective counselling to reduce alcohol use. SBI begins with a 3-item validated questionnaire known as AUDIT-C (Alcohol



Use Disorder Identification Test – Concise) that is typically completed within seconds to minutes (paper or online (Change4Health - e-alcohol screening and brief intervention (e-SBI) versions in Chinese and English are available) while waiting to see the doctor.

No room for complacency

Effective reduction of alcohol harm is best achieved by implementing WHO's SAFER package^{vi} which describes 5 best buys. These involve raising alcohol tax, limiting alcohol availability, restricting alcohol marketing, enforcing drink driving laws and screening/treating alcohol use disorders. Family physicians play a pivotal role in helping drinkers cut down on drinking and informing the public about health and social risk of drinking. Here are a few take home messages for your patients –

- No form or amount of alcohol consumption is risk-free.
- Drinking in moderation is NOT protective of the heart vii .
- Alcohol consumption harms the drinker as well as others.

- Non-drinkers should not start drinking.
- Drinkers should be informed and supported to reduce and stop drinking altogether.

Interpretation of NT-proBNP in heart failure

It is common to see patients presented with dyspnea on exertion and lower limbs edema labelled congestive heart failure (CHF) after admission to hospital being discharged with oral daily furosemide. After transthoracic echocardiography (TTE) examination showing left ventricular ejection fraction (LVEF) 60%, can we say that this patient has no heart failure? The answer is no.

Heart failure is a complex clinical syndrome that results from any structural or functional impairment of ventricular filling or ejection of blood. The etiology of heart failure in extensive with ischemic heart disease being the leading cause. Symptoms include ankle edema, dyspnea on exertion, orthopnea, paroxysmal nocturnal dyspnea, etc. Heart failure can be classified according to LVEF. For diagnosis of heart failure, clinical symptoms and signs are still important while transthoracic echocardiography (TTE) helps to diagnose heart failure with reduced ejection fraction (HFrEF) and heart failure with mildly reduced ejection fraction (HFmrEF). For heart failure with preserved ejection fractioin (HFpEF), the diagnosis is difficult because these patients have LEVF>50%. We require

supporting evidence from TTE and raised natriuretic peptides(NPs) to confidently say patients have HFpEF.

Natriuretic peptides are hormones that with principal expression products of the endocrine function of the heart. NP family are atrial natriuretic peptides (ANPs), brian or B-type natriuretic peptide (BNPs). ANPs and BNPs are mostly synthesized in the heart. BNPs is the active hormone. N-terminal pro B-type natriuretic peptide (NT proBNP) is an inactive peptide for making BNPs. NT-proBNP is a widely used marker for diagnosis and prognosis of heart failure. The causes of raised BNPs/ NT-pro BNP are summarized in table 1. Most common causes are due to cardiac and pulmonary causes but aging, female sex and low BMI can also cause higher hormone levels. NT-proBNP has 79% sensitivity and 87% specificity for acute heart failure. The age-independent cutoff off 300ng/L has a 98% negative predictive value to exclude acute heart failure (Table 2). Therefore, normal level of NT-proBNP is helpful in excluding heart failure. BNP/NT-proBNP levels have prognostic implications for patients with chronic heart failure.

It is important to note the limitations of these markers. High NT-proBNP levels do not exclude presence of other diseases nor diagnostic. It is used as an adjuvant to clinical assessment but levels alone are not sufficient to guide therapeutic decisions in patients with heart failure. Therefore, we should always ask on clinical history, perform physical examinations and order TTE for patients with suspected heart failure.
